 same to be satisfactory in all particu-
 lars without making any changes
 therein;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by
 the Common Council of the City of

 ter Street, above described, be im-
 proved by grading the same to a
 width of sixteen feet along the center
 of said street and covering the same
 with crushed rock to a suitable depth
 and width, according to the estab-
 lished grade and the plans and
 specifications of the City Engineer on
