

SOMETHING PARTNERS SHOULD KNOW

Partnership and Personal Service Corporation Income Tax Returns

Internal Revenue Collector, Milton A. Miller, has received from Washington a full supply of income tax returns for distribution to partnerships and personal service corporations throughout the state of Oregon, and they will now be furnished upon request. Every partnership and personal service corporation engaged in business during any part of the calendar year 1918, must make and file a return with the collector on or before June 15, 1919, regardless of the amount of its gross or net income.

While the tax upon income of partnerships and personal service corporations is payable by the individual members thereof, a return must be filed showing the result of their activities during the calendar year 1918.

Heavy penalties are imposed by statute for failure on the part of any taxpayer to file required returns within the time prescribed by law.

MAY REENLIST IN U. S. MARINES

Discharged soldiers and marines may enlist for direct duty overseas from now until fall, at which time they will be returned to the United States and discharged. The object of this splendid offer of a five months trip to France is to relieve the Marines now serving in the army of occupation, who have been overseas for the past two years. This is an opportunity of a lifetime for an ex-soldier or marine who served his time in the states to take that much desired trip to France, with the assurance of a discharge upon return in the fall. This offer does not hold good for long, so take advantage now. Applications may be made to any postmaster or Marine recruiting station.

Four year enlistments are also being made of men between the ages

of seventeen and forty years who have had no previous military service, for duty in the United States and abroad. The pay of a private in the Marine Corps is thirty dollars a month, with clothes and medical attention furnished free.

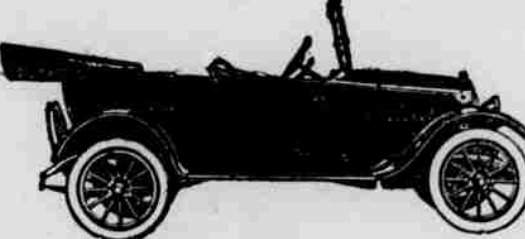
