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FATHER AND SON WEEK

National Father and Son Week, which a year ago brought together in meetings of various sorts a million boys and their fathers, promises to become an annual institution of growing importance in the family life of the United States. February 16 to 22 are the dates designated for its next observance and already the inquiries coming into the Boys' Work Division of the Y. M. C. A. which is promoting the movement indicates a much more general observance of the week in 1920 than in 1919.

The purpose of the meetings formal and informal during the week is to get fathers to renew their interest in their paternal obligations, to lead sons to a deeper respect and appreciation of both in the work and support of the church.

The suggested program for the week designates Monday, February 16th, as final preparation day, when the general committee meets in every community and completes its final arrangements for the week's activities. Tuesday is to be "Home Day" and it is planned to have fathers on that day spend the evening with their sons at home. Wednesday is to be "Father's Day," when fathers will meet for conferences and discussions of the various phases of the eternal boy problem with which they are confronted. Thursday is to be "Tell Your cBy Day," when fathers will be expected to tell the boys things they ought to know about their social and mental life. Friday will be marked by thousands of fathers and son banquets, held in the churches, Y. M. C. A.'s and other community and social centers. Saturday will be designated as "Recreation Day" when fathers and sons in large or small groups, will take the day off for a picnic in the woods. Sunday, February 22, will mark the close of the week, and will be known as "Fathers and Sons Go to Church Sunday."

COURT PROCEEDINGS

ORDER

IN THE COUNTY COURT OF THE STATE OF OREGON, FOR THE COUNTY OF COLUMBIA.

IN the Matter of the Application for the Incorporation of the Town of Scappoose.

The above entitled matter having come on to be heard on the 10th day of January, 1920, upon the petition of fifty-six persons for the incorporation of the Town of Scappoose, said petition having theretofore been filed with the County Clerk of Columbia County on January 2nd, 1920, and having originally come on for hearing on Wednesday, the 7th day of January, 1920, said day being the first day of the regular session of the County Court for the transaction of county business, and said hearing having been adjourned until the 10th day of January, 1920, at the request of W. H. Cooper, Esq., representing certain parties desiring to remonstrate against the allowance of said petition, and it appearing to the Court that the petition presented was signed by more than forty qualified electors of Columbia County, residents within the exterior boundaries of that tract described in the petition now before the court, and it further appearing to the Court that the portion of Columbia county proposed to be incorporated into the Town of Scappoose contains more than 150 inhabitants.

And the Court having considered the objections filed and presented by W. H. Cooper, Esq., on behalf of certain legal voters of Columbia county and residents within the exterior boundaries of the tract described in the petition, against the proposed incorporation, finds that the same are not well taken and said objections are therefore overruled.

The Court further finds that the petition praying that there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Oregon, County of Columbia, residing within that portion of Columbia County, State of Oregon, described therein and herein after described, at a special election to be called by this Court the question whether or not that portion of Columbia County shall be incorporated as a municipal corporation, to be known as the Town of Scappoose, is just, and that said question of whether such proposed portion of Columbia County, Oregon, should be incorporated as the Town of Scappoose, should be submitted to the inhabitants of the said territory in accordance with the provisions of that certain act of the legislative assembly of the State of Oregon, passed at its regular session held in 1913, and entitled, "An Act to Provide for the Organization and Incorporation of Cities and Towns and to Legalize such Corporations as heretofore have been incorporated under Chapter I of Title XXVI of Lord's Oregon Laws, and are now exercising the functions of incorporated cities and towns under such attempted incorporations," and as amended.

It is therefore this 10th day of January, 1920, ORDERED that said petition praying for incorporation of that portion of Columbia County, Oregon, described in said petition as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at the point of intersection of the North line of Section Thirteen (13), Township Three (3) North, Range Two (2) West, Willamette Meridian, with the southern line of the William Watts Donation Land Claim as located over and across said Section for a place of beginning, and running thence Easterly, tracing the north line of said Section Thirteen (13), to a point in said North line of said Section Thirteen (13), distant Seven Hundred and Eighty (780) feet east from the Easterly line of the right of way of the Northern Pacific Railway Company, as said right of way is now located over and across said section Thirteen (13); thence Northerly and parallel with the Easterly line of the right of way of said Railway Company a distance of Twenty-seven Hundred Fifty feet (2,750) feet more or less to a point in the center of County Road now known as the St. Helens Road; thence Easterly and tracing the center line of said County Road Four Hundred Ninety (490) feet more or less to an angle in said road; thence Northwesterly and tracing the center line of said County Road to the point of intersection thereof with the Northerly line of the right of way of the Portland and Southwestern Railroad Company; thence Northwesterly and along the Northerly line of the right of way of said Portland and Southwestern Railroad Company to the point of intersection thereof with the center line of the South Fork of Scappoose Creek; thence tracing the center line of the South Fork of Scappoose Creek up said stream and in a general Southerly direction and following the meanderings of said Creek to the point of first intersection of the center line of said Creek with the said Southerly line of said William Watts donation land claim, or with a prolongation Westerly of said Southerly line of said Watts donation land claim as the case may be; thence Easterly along said Southerly line of said Watts donation land claim or a prolongation thereof, as the case may be, to the place of beginning; be incorporated as a municipal corporation to be known as the Town of Scappoose in accordance with the provisions of the law in such cases made and provided, and

It is further ORDERED that a special election be held at Watts' and Price's Hall, said place being within the proposed boundaries of said Town of Scappoose on Friday, the 27th day of February, 1920, and that at such election there be submitted to the legal voters residing in that portion of Columbia County embraced within the exterior boundaries of that tract described in said petition, and herein above described, the question whether said portion of said Columbia County shall be incorporated as a municipal corporation to be known as the Town of Scappoose in accordance with the provisions of the law in such cases made and provided, and

It is further ORDERED that the ballot to be used at such special election shall read as follows: "Shall that portion of Columbia County described as:

"Commencing at the point of intersection of the North line of Section Thirteen (13), Township Three (3) North, Range Two (2) West, Willamette Meridian, with the Southern line of the William Watts Donation Land Claim as located over and across said section for a place of beginning, and running thence Easterly, tracing the North line of said section Thirteen (13) to a point in said north line of said section Thirteen (13), distant Seven Hundred Eighty (780) feet East from the Easterly line of the right of way of the Northern Pacific Railway Company as said right of way is now located over and across said section Thirteen (13); thence Northerly and parallel with the Easterly line of the right of way of said Railway Company a distance of Twenty-seven Hundred Fifty feet (2,750) feet more or less to a point in the center of the County Road now known as the St. Helens Road; thence Easterly and tracing the center line of said County Road Four Hundred Ninety (490) feet more or less to an angle in said road; thence Northwesterly and tracing the center line of said County Road to the point of intersection thereof with the Northerly line of the right of way of the Portland and Southwestern Railroad Company; thence Northwesterly and along the Northerly line of the right of way of said Portland and Southwestern Railroad Company to the point of intersection thereof with the center line of the South Fork of Scappoose Creek; thence tracing the center line of the South Fork of Scappoose Creek up said stream and in a general Southerly direction and following the meanderings of said Creek to the point of first intersection of the center line of said Creek with the said Southerly line of said William Watts donation land claim, or with a prolongation Westerly of said Southerly line of said Watts donation land claim as the case may be; thence Easterly along said Southerly line of said Watts donation land claim or a prolongation thereof, as the case may be, to the place of beginning; be incorporated as a municipal corporation to be known as the Town of Scappoose in accordance with the provisions of the law in such cases made and provided, and

It is further ORDERED that the judges and clerks of said election shall return the canvass of the vote, together with the ballots cast, to the County Clerk of Columbia County within ten days after said election.

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In the Matter of the petition of John A. Wattson et al. for a county line road.

Now on this 9th day of January, 1920, comes on for consideration in open Court the report of the Board of County Road Viewers in the above entitled matter, said report having been publicly read on two different days of this term of Court, and no remonstrance or petition having been filed in said matter, except a claim presented in writing by Mrs. Pauline Saxton asking \$100.00 for the rebuilding of a certain fence, which claim the Court hereby ordered rejected; and the Court at this time having considered the report of the Board of Road Viewers and said report being favorable thereto, and reporting no damages, as the benefit of the road will cover value of any lands so taken;

And the Court being at this time fully satisfied that said County Line Road will be of public utility, it is Therefore Ordered, by the Court that said report, survey, profile and plat be recorded in suitable books used for that purpose, and from this date said road shall be and the same is hereby declared to be a public highway.

And it appearing to the Court that, by the terms of said report of the Board of County Road Viewers that that portion of said road designated to be opened and maintained by Columbia county is described as follows: We recommend that Multnomah county build and maintain said road from the initial point to station 2179, and that Columbia county build and maintain the balance of said road, which is to be forty feet in width.

It is further ordered by the Court that the County Clerk prepare and transmit to the County Clerk of Multnomah county a certified copy

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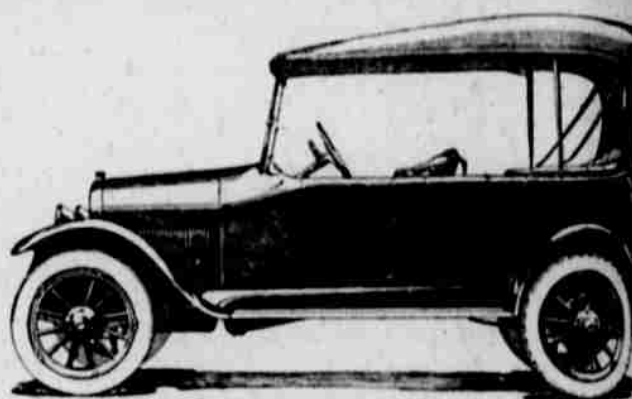
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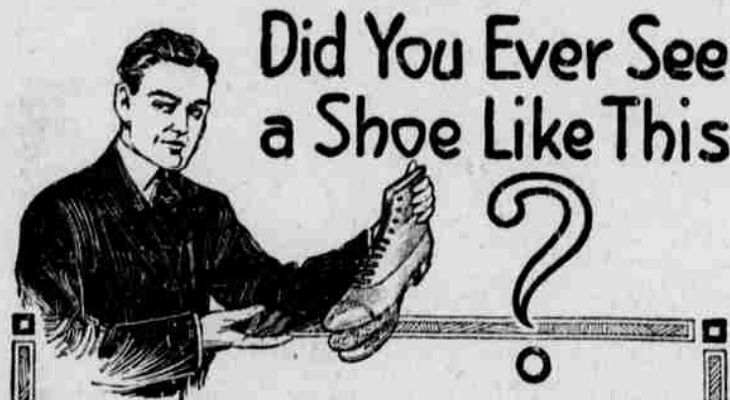
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
