Salem—Motor vehicle tax January 1 to March 15, 1,114,645. Pendleton—Negro residents to build \$2500 church. Oakland—\$300 acre stock ranch sells for \$20,000. Lacombe—Oil struck at depth of 145 feet. Lebanon to have one of best equipped fire trucks soon. Echo—Reith highway nearly completed. Marshfield—New veneer plant to be erected soon. Albany lumber mill receives new machinery. La Grande—6-acre tract sells for \$4000. Umatilla—Fish ladder at Three Mile Falls to be repaired. Eugene—County fair grounds to be improved. Baker to vote April 10 on \$40,000 Goodrich creek. Astoria—Contract awarded for 500 feet new wharfage and two warehouses. Portland—Contract let for ten residences in Irvington. Otis Elevator Co. to build \$30,000 factory.
