

COURT PROCEEDINGS

The proclamation being made, the proceedings were had. The same read, approved and signed. On this day it is ordered by the Court that A. L. Clark be, and he is hereby appointed County Commissioner of Columbia County, Oregon, for the unexpired term of A. Harvey, resigned.

In this day A. L. Clark presents to the Court his Certificate of Appointment as per order heretofore by the Court, together with his duties of office, and the Court being advised in the matter, it is ordered that said appointment be, and the same is hereby approved. Whereupon the said A. L. Clark assumed the duties of his said office.

On this day the Clerk presents to the Court his statement of salaries issued during the month of May, 1920, as authorized and be as follows:

On this 5th day of May A. P. presents to the Court his claim for indemnity in the sum of \$5.00 for six registered cows and a registered bull over the age of 2 years, slaughtered under the provision of the State Live Stock Sanitary Board under the provisions of the law relating thereto, and it appearing to the Court that thirty days have not elapsed since the date of the said slaughter and the date of filing of the said petition and claim, and the Court, being advised in the matter, it is ordered that a public hearing of the claim be held in the County Court Room in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, at 2 o'clock P. M. on the 2nd day of June, 1920, for the purpose of determining whether or not the said claimant has complied with all the laws in regard thereto, and whether or not he is entitled to receive the said indemnity as claimed.

G. Wikstrom to a stake marked (C), thence along the foot of the hill on the most practical route to a stake marked (D) in the middle of the Highway 100 feet North of the North approach of the Highway bridge across the North Fork of Scappoose Creek.

Said road not to be over 40 feet wide; said road is a necessary road for the following reasons. That it will give the residents in the neighborhood of Spitzenberg and down the creek from there a water level grade and eliminate a hard hill on the old road; for the reason that the mail carrier would be able to take one road out and come back on the other road and save considerable distance of travel and give mail service to people on the above described road.

And it is satisfactorily appearing to the Court from the proof filed herein that due notice of the pendency of this proceeding has been given as by law required, and that twelve of the said petitioners are free-holders and residents within the district or districts of the said proposed road, and that a good and sufficient bond as by law required has been given and filed herein.

Sullivan, asking for a refund of taxes erroneously paid between the years 1909 and 1917, inclusive, upon the timberlands in the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 3, Twp. 6, Range 5 West; amounting in the aggregate to the sum of \$266.67.

Petitioner further asks that he be credited upon the 1918 tax roll for the over-assessment upon the timberlands in the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 3, Twp. 6, Range 5 West, in an amount estimated by the County Assessor to be \$1170.00.

And the Court being in the matter advised, it is now hereby ordered by the Court that the refund of taxes paid by petitioner between the years 1909 and 1918, amounting in their aggregate to the sum of \$266.67, be, and the same is hereby denied.

And it appearing to the Court that the applicant is an Order of good moral character, it is ordered by the Court that the County Clerk issue a license to the Tillamook Tribe No. 52 Improved Order of Redmen to conduct a dance at hall of 1440 square feet at Yankton, Columbia County, Oregon, during the year 1920.

Now at this time comes on for hearing the application of Burt West, heretofore filed, asking that he be granted a license to conduct a dance

Whereas, at a Special Election duly and regularly held on the 30th day of April, 1920, in the Town of Scappoose, Oregon, there was submitted to the legal voters thereof the matter of electing a Mayor, Six Aldermen, a Recorder, a Marshall and a Treasurer; and

Whereas, at such election so held the following candidates received the majority of votes cast for their respective offices and being as follows: For Mayor, J. G. Watts, 45 votes; for Recorder, C. F. Cathcart, 51 votes; for Treasurer, Mrs. E. E. Wist, 53 votes; for Marshall Fred Smith, 42 votes; for Alderman, G. W. Grant, 42 votes; Chas. Wikstrom 59 votes; E. E. Wist, 55 votes; W. C. Campbell, 53 votes; M. B. Grewell, 57 votes; and D. W. Price 49 votes.

It is therefore ordered by the Court that the clerk be, and he is hereby authorized and instructed to issue Certificates of Election to the above named candidates.

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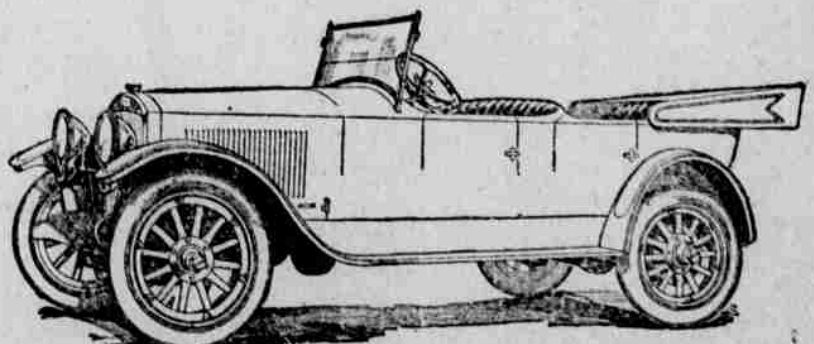
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
