FURNITURE FACTORY SELLS ENTIRE OUTPUT

Manager George McBride of the Columbia City Furniture company informs the Mist that the company have contracted with a large furniture buying house to take the entire output of the furniture factory. Recently the company have installed small sawmill and are sawing lumber and other native woods for furniture making purposes. For the present the factory is making only dining tables, Davenport tables and living room tables of the William and Mary pattern. Later on they manufacture other furniture. Twelve men are employed at the present time and the force will soon be increased.

MAKING WAR ON OBNOXIOUS WEEDS

Perhaps it is not known to many, but forgotten by others, that under laws of Oregon owners or occupants of land are required to remove from their premises all Cantharides, quack grass and maritima before it blooms or forms seed.

A petition is in circulation this week to be presented to the county court asking for the enforcement of law relating to a district comprising the Perry Donation Land and the Boyles Donation Land. The enactment of this law was to prevent the spread of these obnoxious weeds. Allowed to flourish and unchecked they spread rapidly and soon have every other form of vegetation stifled and killed out. Weeds are gaining a start in districts named and those interested in their destruction are asking county court to take some action to have those derelict in the duty of destroying the weeds busy.
