## Happy Breeding Grounds

These two bulls were sold at the first National Co-operative sale which was held at St. Paul, Minnesota, and the animals which were put up for sale were the pick of the whole United States.

## Only Club of Its Kind

The Oregon Agricultural college boasts a 4-H college club of 46 members. According to George E. Farrell, national club leader, this is the only club of its kind in existence. All of the members were formerly members of boys' and girls' clubs.

## Purebreds for Smith River Club

Seven registered Jersey calves, purchased from C. R. Burkard near Albany, Ore., were shipped immediately following the Jersey jubilee to the Smith River section, in Douglas county, where they will be distributed among calf club members.

Purchase of these calves was made possible through E. A. Sweet, county club leader, with the assistance of L. I. Allen, state live stock club leader, and C. J. Hurd.

The seven club members who purchased the calves will enter the dairy herd record keeping project, placing seven heifers on official test, and will also enter the calf project with calves from seven heifers.

These club members are bringing to the Smith River district some of the best Jersey blood to be procured anywhere, according to H. C. Seymour, state club leader.

## Club Wins Distinction

The Umatilla Dairy Herd Record club of Umatilla county, Oregon, has the distinction of being the first club of the kind in the state to turn in its final report to H. C. Seymour, state club leader. It is in the "10 per cent efficient" class, inasmuch as all members have completed their projects.

## WEATHER REPORT

FOR JULY, 1920

Max temp. 93 degrees on 7th; min. 43 degrees on 4th and 24th. Mean max temp. 74.6 degrees; mean min. 52.6 degrees. Mean monthly temp. 63.6 degrees, which is 1.4 degrees above normal. Rain 1.93 inch, or 0.03 inch below average. Greatest daily rainfall 0.76 inch on 12th. Thunder on 13th, 16th, 17th and 21st. There were 14 clear, 19 partly cloudy and 7 cloudy days, while measurable rain fell on 4 days. Month was favorable for growing crops and with the exception of the week from 11-17th, favorable for harvesting. Much has been damaged by rain, however, none was spoiled. Winter grain ripened fast, potatoes, vegetables and root crops grew well, so that by the end of the month the backwardness of the spring was evened to the average season.
