Such weeds should be removed before any of them has shed its bloom or commenced to form seed. Chapter 287 of the General Laws of Oregon provides that if such weeds are not removed within ten days after notice, they may be removed by the person appointed by the County Court at the expense of the person owning or occupying the premises and become a lien on the land.
