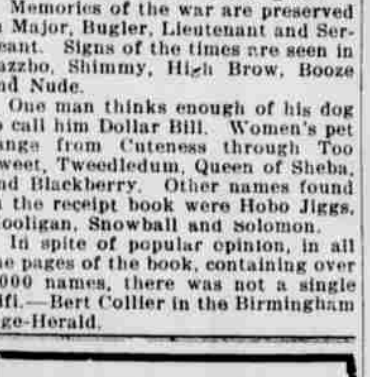
A Sufficient Excuse

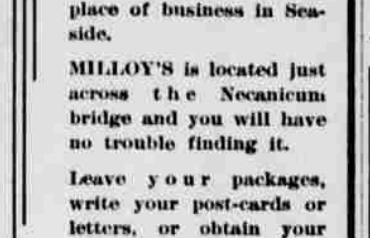
