

SUMMONS

In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Columbia County.
Swan Swanson, Plaintiff, vs. Samuel E. Atchinson, Defendant.
To Samuel E. Atchinson, Defendant:
In the name of the State of Oregon: You are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit on or before the 29th day of November, 1920, that being the date fixed by the order of the court for you to appear or answer, and more than six weeks from the date of the first publication of this summons, and if you fail to so appear or answer, the plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded in the complaint filed herein, to-wit:

That the mortgage executed by you to the plaintiff on the 8th day of April, 1918, be reformed by correcting the error in the description of the property described in said mortgage so as to make the description read: Tracts 57 and 61 Scappoose Acre Tracts according to the plat thereof on file and of record in the office of the County Clerk of Columbia County, State of Oregon."

That plaintiff have judgment against you for the sum of \$1200.00 with interest thereon at the rate of 10 per cent per annum from the 8th day of April, 1918, until paid, and the further sum of \$15.84 for the 1918, taxes paid by plaintiff, with interest thereon from the 13th day of May, 1919, at the rate of 10 per cent per annum, and the further sum of \$18.66 taxes paid by plaintiff for the year 1919, with interest thereon at the rate of 10 per cent per annum from the 12th day of March, 1920, until paid, and for the further sum of \$120.00 as attorney's fees, and for costs and disbursements of this suit;

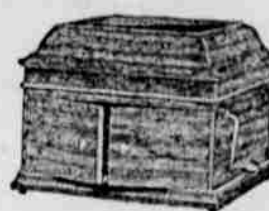
