ORDINANCE NO. 234

An Ordinance Apportioning and Assessing the cost of the Improvement of all that portion of Columbia Street in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, from the Southerly line of Cowlitz Street to a point 406 feet South of said South line of Cowlitz Street; and the Westerly half of said Columbia Street from said point 406 feet South of the South line of Cowlitz Street, to the center line of Tualatin Street, upon the lands, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon said improvement recently completed under Ordinance No. 236, of said City. Whereas, the Common Council of said City having deemed it expedient and necessary to improve all that portion of Columbia Street, in the City of St. Helens, Oregon, from the southerly line of Cowlitz Street to a point 406 feet south of said south line of Cowlitz Street; and the westerly half of said Columbia Street from said point 406 feet south of the south line of Cowlitz Street, to the center line of Tualatin Street, and also all of McCormick Street from the center of Columbia Street to the westerly edge of the Strand, all in said City, by grading, curbing and paving the same, in accordance with the plans and specifications and estimates of the City Engineer filed with the Recorder of said City on the 19th day of May, 1919;

And Whereas, the said City Engineer having filed said plans, specifications of the work and estimates of the cost thereof and the said Common Council having found the same satisfactory, did, on the 26th day of May, 1919, pass a resolution adopting and approving said plans, specifications of the work and estimate of the cost thereof did determine the boundaries of the district benefited and the property to be assessed for such improvement; and said Council did declare its intention and purpose to make such improvement in accordance with said plans, specifications and estimates, and assess the costs of such improvement upon the real property abutting upon said improvement and benefited thereby, which property was in said resolution described as and the same actually is described as follows, to-wit: Lots 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 17, and all that portion of lots 5 and 18, not included in McCormick Street, all in Block 10, in the City of St. Helens, Oregon; and all of Lots 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22, in Block 19 in said City, all being in Columbia County, Oregon;

And Whereas, said resolution contained a notice requiring all persons desiring to remonstrate against the proposed improvement to file their remonstrances with the Recorder of said City within twenty days from the date of the first publication and advertisement of said notice and resolution; And Whereas, the Recorder of said City did on the 27th day of June, 1919, advertise said resolution and the whole thereof containing said notice, and did give said notice by publication thereof in the St. Helens Mist, a newspaper of general circulation published in said City for three consecutive issues thereof, the first publication being made on June 27, 1919, and the second being on July 4, 1919, and the third on July 11, 1919;

And Whereas, no objections to said improvement were made or filed with the Recorder of said City, or otherwise, and no remonstrance whatever was made against said improvement; And Whereas, said Common Council, after having found said improvement necessary to meet the actual wants and conveniences of the residents of said City and district and the owners of the real property abutting upon said improvement; that such improvement will greatly benefit the property so abutting thereon; and that the health, convenience, happiness, interest and prosperity of the people of said City and City and of the owners of the real property abutting upon said improvement, would be promoted and advanced by such improvement;

And Whereas, on August 3, 1919, an ordinance numbered 234, was duly enacted by the Common Council of said City and approved by the Mayor of the said City within six months from the date of the first publication of the notice, above mentioned, providing for the construction of said improvement and upon the taking effect of said ordinance, the Recorder of said City gave notice by publication in the St. Helens Mist, a newspaper published in said City, as required by the Charter thereof, inviting proposals for making said improvement, and in response thereto said City received one bid or proposal for the construction of said improvement, which proposal was received and filed on October 13, 1919; and was by said City accepted as to the improvement of said portion of Columbia Street only (the Council estimating the cost of improvement of McCormick Street too great); and on the 3rd day of November 1919, said City and said bidder, the Warren Construction Company, entered into a contract for the construction of said improvement of said portion of Columbia Street.

And Whereas, said improvement of said portion of Columbia Street was completed in whole to the satisfaction of the City Engineer superintending such work; and whereas said engineer filed with the Recorder of said City a certificate of such completion and the approval of such work; and the City Recorder, upon having received the 28th day of June, 1920, posted notices of such completion in three public places in said City, and also published notice thereof in the St. Helens Mist, a newspaper of general circulation in said City, the issue of which notice was published on the 9th day of June, 1920, and said notice in all which notices was stated that objections to such completion would be heard and considered by said Council on Monday, July 13, 1920, at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of said day; and no person whatsoever has made or filed any objection or

said 12th day of July, 1920, duly accepted the same; and the Engineer having duly certified to the Recorder the accuracy of the original estimate of the work; And Whereas said Common Council did on the 16th day of August, 1920, duly apportion the cost of said improvement upon the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land adjudged by the Council to be directly and indirectly benefited thereby in accordance with the benefit directly or indirectly derived by each lot and part of lot and parcel of land so affected; And Whereas, the Recorder having given notice of said proposed assessment as required by law for a period of fifteen days, which notice specified the whole cost of such improvement, the share so apportioned to each lot, part of lot or parcel of land with the name of the owners thereof and stating that any objections to such apportionment might be made in writing to the Council and filed with the Recorder within fifteen days from the date of the posting or giving such notice; and a notice of the amount so apportioned to each lot, part thereof or parcel of land with the whole cost of such improvement, and the name of the owners, having been given by the Recorder as required by law;

And Whereas, the St. Helens Lumber Company have filed a request that the sum of \$867.54, the cost of the improvement of the St. Helens Dock & Terminal Company right of way in said Columbia Street be assessed against and made a lien upon its lot No. 5, in Block 10, of said City; and also signed and filed a waiver of any irregularity in the proceedings, or any of the proceedings of the improvement of lot 4, in said Block 10; And Whereas, no objections whatever have been made to said apportionment and assessment and no remonstrances filed thereto either in response to said notice, or at all; and that said notice was made, dated, posted and published, the publication thereof being in the St. Helens Mist, a weekly newspaper of general circulation in said City, according to law for more than fifteen days after said proposed assessment, said notice being dated, posted and published on August 27th, 1920, and the publication thereof ending on the 3rd day of September, 1920;

And Whereas, said Common Council on the 12th day of September, 1920, the same being more than fifteen days after the giving of said notice, having duly and fully considered the said proposed assessment, and there being no objections thereto, and the Council, considering that the amounts so apportioned to each lot, part thereof or parcel of land are in the proportions to the benefits derived thereby, and having ordered that said assessment as heretofore determined be declared by ordinance; And Whereas, in accordance with the provisions of said Charter and the order of said Council, the City of St. Helens does ordain as follows:

That the cost of the street improvement of said Columbia Street in said City of St. Helens, from the southerly line of Cowlitz Street, southerly to the center line of Tualatin Street in said City, is hereby found to be \$867.54, of which \$499.45, and said sum is hereby apportioned, less the sum of \$329.23, for retroactions upon the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon said improvement and hereinafter particularly described, and said apportionment and assessment is hereby declared to be an equitable assessment upon said real property benefited hereby and is as follows, to-wit: Assessment
