

COURT PROCEEDINGS

Due proclamation being made the following proceedings were had: Journal read, approved and signed.

On this day W. J. Fullerton, County Commissioner elect, having filed with the clerk of this court his certificate of election together with his oath of office, thereupon assumes the duties of his said office.

On this day the clerk presents to the court his statement of seal counties issued during the month of December, 1920, as authorized and being as follows:

Dec. 6, 1920, warrant No. 4715 for \$3.00 in favor of Stanley H. Thomat.

And the court being advised in the matter it is ordered that the said statement be, and the same is hereby approved and accepted.

On this day the following officers elect present to the court their certificates of election, together with their respective oaths of office, duly subscribed as by law required, together with his or her official undertaking in the amount fixed by law by the order of court heretofore filed with the clerk of this court, being as follows:

J. W. Hunt, county clerk, undertaking in the amount of \$10,000.00 National Surety Co., of New York, J. B. Wilkerson, school superintendent, undertaking in the amount of \$2,000 by the Fidelity and Deposit Co., of Maryland.

L. J. Van Orshoven, county surveyor, undertaking in the amount of \$2,000.00 by the Fidelity and Deposit Co., of Maryland.

C. W. Blakesley, county assessor, undertaking in the amount of \$5,000 by the Fidelity and Deposit Co., of Maryland.

Beulah Hattan, county treasurer, undertaking in the amount of \$20,000.00 by the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Co., of Maryland.

T. S. White, coroner, undertaking in the amount of \$3,000.00 by the Fidelity and Deposit Co., of Maryland.

And the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered that all the said undertakings be and they are hereby approved.

On this day it is ordered by the court that the amount of the undertaking of J. H. Wellington, as tax collector of Columbia county, Oregon, and the same is hereby fixed in the amount of \$20,000.00.

On this day J. H. Wellington, sheriff-elect presents to the court his certificate of election, together with his oath of office, duly subscribed as by law required, together with his undertaking in the amount of \$10,000.00 by the National Surety Co., of N. Y., together with an additional undertaking as tax collector, in the amount of \$20,000.00 by the Fidelity and Deposit Co., of Maryland, and the court being advised in the matter it is ordered by the court that said undertakings be and they hereby are approved and accepted.

On this day H. E. Vozzie presents to the court his appointment as deputy county clerk, together with the oath of office duly subscribed by him as by law provided, and the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered that said appointment be, and the same is hereby approved.

On this day B. P. Graves presents to the court his appointment to the office of deputy sheriff, together with the oath of office duly subscribed by him, as by law provided, and the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court that said appointment be, and the same is hereby approved.

On this day it is ordered by the court that W. Harrison be, and he is hereby appointed janitor for the court house for the year 1921, and the salary for said janitor be, and the same is hereby fixed in the amount of \$125.00 per month.

On this day it is ordered by the court that Dr. L. C. Ross be, and he is hereby appointed Secretary of the Board of Health, in and for Columbia county, Oregon, and the salary of office is to be \$20.00 per month, payable as by law provided.

On this day it is ordered by the court that the widow's pension hereunto allowed Sophie Karl, in the amount of \$25.00 per month be, and the same is hereby discontinued.

On this day it is ordered by the court that the aid heretofore allowed Estella Winchell in addition to the widow's pension be, and the same is hereby increased to the sum of \$20.00 per month, and that the court issue a general fund warrant in the sum of \$10.00 as balance for the month of January.

On this day Judson Weed, commissioner of John Buecher Post No. 70, G. O. P., presents to the court his report of his transactions in the S. & S. Indigent Fund of Columbia county, together with vouchers for such expenditures, and the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered that said report be, and the same is hereby approved.

On this day the report of the road viewers on the L. H. road was read in open court for the first time.

On this day there is presented to the court the written resignation of W. J. Fullerton, as a member of Columbia county fair board, said resignation to take effect immediately, the court being advised in the matter, it is, by the court ordered that said resignation be, and the same is hereby accepted.

On this day the matter coming on for consideration by the court, it is ordered by the court that Mr. P. H. be and he hereby is appointed member of the Columbia county fair board to fill out the unexpired term of W. J. Fullerton, resigned, it is further ordered by the court that Mrs. I. R. Kelly, of Clatsop county, Oregon be, and she is hereby appointed as a member of the Columbia county fair board for the term of three years.

On this day comes on for consideration of the court the auditor's report for the year 1919, and the court being in the matter fully advised, it therefore now ordered by the court that said report be and the same is hereby approved and accepted.

On this 5th day of January 1921, comes on for hearing the petition of A. E. Lund et al free holders residing in the road district or districts of the said proposed road praying for the establishment of a county road as follows:

Beginning at a stake driven in the center of the R. R. track where the Berg road crosses, thence N. 122 1/2 degrees E. 122 1/2 feet to a stake driven in the center of the R. R. track, thence East 48 1/2 feet to stake A at the edge of old county road, thence West from stake in center of R. R. track 156 feet to stake B and terminating at edge of paved highway.

And the court being advised in the matter, it is ordered by the court that said petition be and the same is hereby denied, upon the ground and for the reason that the description is too indefinite and uncertain to give the court jurisdiction to act.

Resolution for County Road Be it remembered, That at a term of the Honorable County Court of Columbia County, State of Oregon, begun and held at the court house in St. Helens in said County, on the first day of December, A. D. 1920, and from day to day thereafter during the continuance of said term. Present: Hon. Martin White, County Judge; Hon. Judson Weed, Commissioner; Hon. A. L. Clark, Commissioner; J. W. Hunt, Clerk; H. E. LaBare, Sheriff.

The following among other proceedings were had, to-wit: This being a regular session of the above entitled court, and at which time the court is allowed by resolution to locate, establish, alter, widen, straighten or change the direction of any road;

And it appearing to the court that a public necessity exists, the court does hereby declare its intention to lay out and establish a county road within said county, described as follows:
