It will cost \$1,500,000 of which about 100 miles will be new construction and hard construction at that.

DAIRYMEN'S LEASE IS CO-OPERATIVE

(Contributed) The first payment to the new members of the Oregon Dairymen's Co-operative League in Zone 5, comprising Clatsop county and parts of Columbia, Washington and Pacific counties was sent out Monday, April 27th. The League operates on the pooled basis, whereby all members' products are sold by the league and the proceeds distributed to the members after deducting operating expenses and a sum sufficient to pay for the plants in five years. The dairymen in Zone 5 became active members of the league on March 1st. The league makes a partial payment on the 25th of the following month, therefore this is their first pay day. The amount paid at this time is: Milk pool, \$2.09 a hundred pounds, of which 50 cents is cash and \$1.59 trade acceptance; sweet cream, 70 cents a pound butterfat, of which 40 cents is cash and 30 cents trade acceptance; churning cream, 40 cents a pound butterfat, of which 25 cents is cash and 15 cents trade acceptance. Final payment covering the balance due members on March milk and cream will be made as soon as all March cheese is sold and all accounts closed. Trade acceptance is a new departure for most dairymen. This is necessary where a large part of the product is made into cheese, a product that requires time to cure and market. Trade acceptance may be cashed at the bank or stores by a slight discount or held until maturity and cashed at face value.

ASTORIA PAPER PRAISES JUDGE CLARK

Under the heading, "Rabner Judge to Minute Leniency with Law," the Astoria Budget has the following article: Somewhere, some time, and some place it has been said that "A Daniel, says a second Daniel, come to judgment." Be that as it may, Leo Rabner, the chairman of the tourist committee of the Chamber of Commerce, is singing the praises of Judge Clark of Rabner for the stand taken by that jurist in a case tried in that city Thursday afternoon. Judge Clarke in the case of the State vs. Nelson and State vs. Weidlander, that were tried at that time, laid down this rule: that hereafter through Rabner or within his jurisdiction if there is an arrest for a speed violation and the offense is not one that endangers life or property that he will employ the "rule of reason." The offender will be given a chance on a suspended sentence and payment of the costs of the arrest by the officer. Judge Clarke made it plain, however, that this is not an invitation for the speed maniac to turn loose in Columbia county. On the con-

trary he called attention to the spacious new city jail that yawns for inmates. His rule, however, was based on the fact that this summer will see many tourists from other parts of the state and other states who may not be acquainted with the road and road laws of this state. And while all the rules of hospitality will be observed the court will hold to the old rule: "Be wise with speed. A fool at forty, is a fool indeed."
