WEATHER REPORT FOR APRIL

Max temp. 72 degrees on 9th; min. 25 degrees on 3; mean max temp. 52.3 degrees; mean min. 36 degrees; mean monthly temp. 44.1 degrees, which is 3.7 below normal; killing frost on 2, 4, 6, 7, 14, 15, 23, and 29; rain 4.17 inches, which is 0.89 inch above the average; thunder on 3; prevailing wind S.E. and N.W.; there were 5 clear, 11 partly cloudy and 14 cloudy days, while measurable rain fell on 19 days. The month was more or less clear up to the 12 and good progress was made with farm work; since the 12th it rained every day, except the 15 and 16, so that very little work could be done on the soil. Grasses and grain are thrifty and fruit trees are blooming profusely; no predictions, however, can be made as yet to any possible damage to the fruit by frost and rain.

IMMIGRANT IS LABOR HEAD

WASHINGTON.—Forty years ago an immigrant boy eight years old from Tredegar, Wales, passed victoriously through the old immigration station at Castle Garden to the land of opportunity which was to accord him high public honors in later life. Recently this boy, James J. Davis, now secretary of labor, stood among the immigrant throngs at the Ellis Island station. He was making the first of a series of inspections in a general survey of immigration regulations on the Atlantic and Pacific coasts, for the purpose, he said, of improving the service "along common-sense and heart-sense lines."

Secretary Davis was not long in putting the "heart-sense" idea into effect. He severed the red tape which would have deported recently a widow and her four little children, and a pretty Polish girl of nineteen years. He ordered that an appealing Spanish stowaway, clad in rags and wearing broken shoes, from whom his bare feet protruded, be outfitted.

The "common sense" Secretary Davis displayed in recommending several changes which he believed would better conditions at Ellis Island, although he said he found "much to praise and little to condemn, in spite of complaints made in the past." The improvements which Secretary Davis favors are re-orientation, where it is required; the establishment of a delousing department, and a plan whereby radicals will not be sent to Ellis Island until the eve of their deportation.
