Whereas, the Fish Commission of the State of Oregon has propagated and stocked, and is propagating and stocking the waters of the Willamette river and the Willamette slough within the State of Oregon, with salmon and other food fish; and

Whereas, the Willamette river and the Willamette slough are frequented by salmon and other food fish, and, for the purpose of protecting the same the said Fish Commission of the State of Oregon has decided to close certain waters of the Willamette river and the waters of the Willamette slough, as follows, to-wit:

All of the waters of the Willamette river north of the suspension bridge crossing the Willamette river between Seventh Street in Oregon City and the County Bridge in West Linn, to the confluence of said waters with the waters of the Columbia river, and all of the waters of the Willamette slough from where the said Willamette slough takes its waters from the main waters of the Willamette river to the confluence of the waters of the Willamette slough with the waters of the Columbia river,

to net fishing or fishing for commercial purposes by any means for salmon and other food fish;  
NOW, THEREFORE, Notice is hereby given by the said Fish Commission of the State of Oregon that the said waters of the Willamette river and the Willamette slough within the counties of Columbia, Multnomah and Clackamas, within the State of Oregon, described as follows, to-wit:

All of the waters of the Willamette river north of the suspension bridge crossing the Willamette river between Seventh Street in Oregon City and the County Bridge in West Linn, to the confluence of said waters with the waters of the Columbia river, and all of the waters of the Willamette slough from where the said Willamette slough takes its waters from the main waters of the Willamette river to the confluence of the waters of the Willamette slough with the waters of the Columbia river,

are, each and all of them are hereby closed to net fishing or fishing for commercial purposes by any means, for salmon and other food fish, from and after the sixth day of June, 1921, until said waters are again opened to said fishing for salmon and other food fish herein prohibited as provided for by section 8 of chapter 195 of the General Laws of Oregon of the year 1921.

And, that on and after the sixth day of June, 1921, it will be unlawful to fish for or take or catch with net or by other means for commercial purposes any salmon or other food fishes in any of said waters. Any and all persons violating the provisions of this notice will be prosecuted as by law provided.
