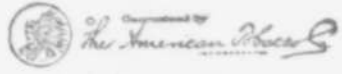

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Boiled puddings should never be turned out as soon as done, as they are liable to break. Let stand half an hour or so. Wipe out a greasy spider with paper before washing it; it keeps grease out of the sink pipes. Cheese kept in a covered jar has a tendency to mold, so I always wrap a piece of waxed paper around it and keep it in the ice box instead. If a dish of food is placed on the ice, put it on a rubber ring from a preserve jar to keep it from slipping. A lamp wick can be used until too short to turn up if a piece of cotton cloth is pinned to it.

Robinson Crusoe's Musket.

The musket said to have been given to Alexander Selkirk when he was put ashore on the island of Juan Fernandez, 400 miles off the Chilean coast, has been going the rounds of British museums. It was Selkirk's adventures upon which was based DePoe's famous story, "Robinson Crusoe." The musket is inscribed with the name of "A. Selkirk Largo 1771." It was purchased by Randolph Berens, for \$4.25, but the owner has insured it for \$10,000.

Selkirk owned a tavern near Chatham, but died in 1723 at sea as a lieutenant aboard a naval vessel.

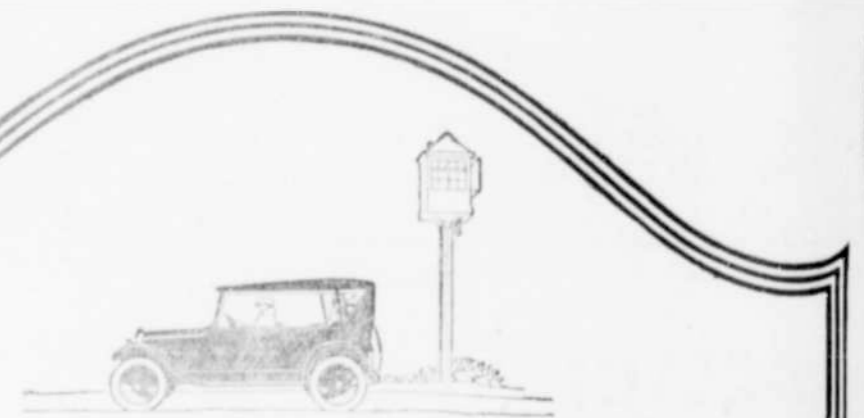
