

COOPERATIVE COUNCIL IS FULLY ORGANIZED

The Oregon Cooperative Council is now a reality, organization having been perfected in Portland.

George A. Mansfield, president of the state farm bureau federation, was chosen to head the council and C. E. Spence, master of the state grange, was made vice-president.

"We plan to protect the cooperative movement in all its phases and to take up the question of finance, transportation, and to promote an educational policy among cooperative associations," said Doctor Macpherson.
