NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

To the owners of the real property subject to assessment for the improvement proposed in the following resolution, herewith attached and made a part of this notice:

You are hereby notified that, pursuant to said resolution and the provisions of the Charter of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, that you may and are hereby requested to make and file with the Recorder of said City of St. Helens, Oregon, within twenty days from the date of the first publication of this notice and resolution, to-wit: Within twenty days from June 24, 1921, your remonstrance or remonstrances against the proposed improvement or grade mentioned in said resolution.

RESOLUTION

Resolution of the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, declaring its intention to improve portions of Pine, Cowlitz and Church Streets in said City; adopting the Engineer's estimate of the Probable cost thereof; adopting plans and specifications for such improvement and repealing resolution heretofore on March 7, 1921, passed by the Common Council.

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, deeming it expedient and necessary to improve that portion of Pine Street in said City from the intersection of said Pine Street with the paved Houlton-St. Helens County road southerly to the intersection thereof with the center line of Cowlitz Street; all that portion of Cowlitz Street from its intersection with the center line of Pine Street westerly to its intersection with the center line of Church Street; and all that portion of Church Street from its intersection with the center line of Cowlitz Street northerly to its intersection with said paved County road, by clearing, grubbing and grading the same to a width of 18 feet and macadamizing the same to a width of 12 feet with crushed rock macadam; the whole improvement to be in accordance with the maps, plans, profiles and specifications on file in the office of the City Recorder of said City;

AND WHEREAS, the Engineer of said City on February 23, 1921, at

the request of said Common Council filed in the office of the City Recorder of said City, maps, plans, profiles and specifications of such improvement with the grade as established by him; and at said time said Engineer also filed an estimate of the probable cost of such improvement, which cost is estimated by said City Engineer to be the sum of \$2860.55

AND WHEREAS, the Common Council of said City having examined said maps, plans, profiles and specifications and the estimate of the probable cost of such improvement now find the same to be satisfactory in all particulars without making any change or changes therein;

NOW THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, that all that portion of Pine Street in said City, lying between the Houlton-St. Helens paved County road and the center line of Cowlitz Street; all of Cowlitz Street between its intersection with the center line of Pine Street and its intersection with the center line of Church Street; and all that portion of Church Street lying between its intersection with the center line of Cowlitz Street and the southerly boundary line of said Houlton-St. Helens paved county road, all in said City be improved by clearing, grubbing and grading the same to the established grade to a width of 18 feet, or 9 feet on either side of the center line of said streets, and covering the said grade with crushed rock macadam pavement to a width of 12 feet, or 6 feet on either side of the center line of said improvement; the macadam pavement to be 9 inches thick and made up of 6 inches of coarse crushed rock well rolled, and 3 inches of binder material and 1 inch rock and screenings all to be wet and rolled into a compact mass; all of said improvements to be in accordance with the established plans, profiles and specifications of the City Engineer on file in the office of the Recorder of said City, which plans, maps, profiles and specifications are here referred to, adopted, and made a part of this resolution; and said Common Council hereby declares its intention to so improve said portions of said Pine, Cowlitz and Church Streets and it is its intention to so improve the same;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Common Council of said City adopt and approve the estimate of the Engineer of said City as referred to; and it also adopts and approves the estimate of the probable cost of the proposed improvement as shown in the sum of \$2860.55 which estimate is itemized as follows: to-wit: 115 cubic yards fill, borrowed at \$1.25 per cubic yd., \$ 381.25 11 cubic yards earth excavation at \$40.00 per cu. yd. 4.40 5000 cubic feet of 9-inch Armco Culvert pipe for roadway in place at \$1.50 per foot 120.00 1773 lineal feet of macadam pavement at \$1.30 per ft. 2304.90 Total \$2860.55

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the cost of said improvement be levied upon and assessed against all of the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land specially benefited by such improvement, as required and directed by the Charter of said City; and it is hereby determined and declared that all the lots of land, specially benefited directly or indirectly are the following, to-wit: Lots 1 and 2 in Block 96; all of lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 in Block 97; all of lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16 and the northerly one-half of

lots 6 and 17 in Block 105; all of block 106 and lots 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21 and 22 in block 113, and also lot 22 in Block 107, all in the City of St. Helens, in Columbia County, Oregon.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all of said lots above described are hereby deemed to be specially benefited, directly and indirectly by such improvement.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Recorder of said City be and he hereby is directed to publish notice of the intention of said Common Council to improve said portions of said streets immediately upon this resolution becoming operative as required by the Charter of said City and notifying the owners of the above described real property subject to assessment for such improvement, that written remonstrances against the proposed improvement may be filed with the Recorder of said City within twenty days from the date of the first publication of said notice;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution be contained and embodied in the notice above mentioned and be published as provided by Section 105 of the Charter of said City in the St. Helens Mist, a newspaper of general circulation in said City of St. Helens, Columbia County, Oregon and published therein;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the resolution heretofore, to-wit: on March 7, 1921, passed by said Common Council, entitled: Resolution of the Common Council of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, declaring its intention to improve portions of Pine, Cowlitz and Church Streets in said City, by clearing and grading the same to a width of 18 feet and macadamizing the same to a width of 12 feet; adopting the Engineer's estimate of the probable cost thereof, and adopting plans and specifications for such improvement. Said improvement to include crushed rock sidewalk along easterly side of Pine Street and northerly side of Cowlitz Street be repealed.

An Island Jungle.

The largest island on the globe, unless the continent of Australia is to be considered an island, is by a strange chance the island about which least is known, says the New York Herald. In fact, it is so seldom heard of that few persons can say offhand where it is or what it name is.

This little known island is New Guinea, also known as Papua. It lies to the north of Australia and is separated from it by a strait of little more than 100 miles in width. An effort to uncover the secrets of this great tropical area is shortly to be made by Dr. Carl Lumholtz, a Norwegian explorer, ethnologist and zoologist, who has recently spent two years in the almost equally unknown depths of Borneo.

It is the plan of Dr. Lumholtz to do what no other white man has yet done. He hopes to penetrate the jungle at one of the broadest points in the island, fight his way through it to the great Snowy Mountain range, climb from the equatorial heat to the bleak tops of the range, 16,000 or more feet above the sea, and make his way to the other side of the island.

"I cannot say now what I will accomplish for science if I succeed in crossing the island, for the interior of New Guinea is still a mystery, and I know no more than any one else what I may find," Dr. Lumholtz said in discussing his venture. "During my explorations in Borneo I heard something concerning New Guinea, which I cannot speak of now except to say that it concerns neither the inhabitants nor the flora fauna of the island. It is more in the mineral line. Without attempting to appear mysterious I can say no more than that the expedition may surprise the world."
