AUTOMATIC TAMPER IS USED IN FILLING SILOS

An automatic tamper used in filling silos has proved successful at the Oregon Agricultural college. The tamper is the first one used in the state. It is said to increase the capacity of silos packed in the ordinary way 50 per cent. Not only does it pack uniformly, but it increases the keeping qualities through looser packing. The automatic tamper is made by the Cushman manufacturing company. It works as a small steam roller which runs around on top of the silage as it is fed into the silo. The operator handles the tamper and the feeder at the same time, therefore cost of operation is increased. The capacity of the silos at O. A. C. was 35 1-2 per cent over the previous record, of close packing, according to J. E. Pollock, dairy herdman at the college. Data and vetch and barley and vetch, in the amount of 275 tons have been put into the college silos this year. All of them have been packed by the automatic tamper. More ensilage of corn and sunflowers will be handled in September.

Application of lime should be light on soils which are poor, light and lacking in organic matter, or dry, but much heavier on those composed largely of clay and well filled with organic matter. The amount of lime to be used will vary from 500 to 3000 pounds to an acre. Where ground limestone is used, such as may be obtained from the state lime plant, the result will not be quite as noticeable the first year as if burnt or slacked lime were used, but will be more lasting.—O. A. C. Experiment Station.
