WEEKLY LUMBER REVIEW

For the week ending July 30th one hundred seven mills in Western Oregon and Western Washington report production at 54,395,454 feet, which is twenty-nine per cent below normal. New business totaled 53,804,283 feet. Shipments totaled 68,395,522 feet. For delivery by rail, new business included 1,204 cars; rail shipments 1,238 cars. Unshipped balance in the rail trade was 2,779 cars. Local business totaled 4,236,237 feet. In the cargo trade, domestic orders totaled 6,987,048 feet; export 6,461,000 feet. Coastwise and inter-coastal cargo shipments totaled 21,325,910 feet; export shipments 5,693,385 feet.

NEWSY ITEMS FROM THE STATE CAPITAL

SALEM, Or., Aug. 5.—(Special.)—At a conference of state traffic officers here a decision was reached to enforce thoroughly all the state road laws. Secretary of State Kozer and T. A. Raffety, chief of the traffic inspectors, addressed the meeting.

J. E. Calavan, industrial field worker for the state department of education, has returned from a tour in Washington, Clatsop, Yamhill and Columbia counties where he investigated boys' and girls' club work. He says good work is being done in sewing, cooking, poultry, pig and calf raising at Waluski, Fernhill, Vosper, Brownsmead, Lewis and Clark, Knappa and Silvindale and other communities.

Members of the state supreme court began their vacations Saturday. To clear the court preparatory for the month's vacation the court departed from the usual custom and handed down opinions on a day other than Tuesday. Nine were handed down Saturday.

Warrants passing through the office of the secretary of state for the month of June aggregated \$2,252,332.40, according to Secretary Kozer. Of this amount \$93,524.17 was issued in a single day.

The Shell Oil company of California has remitted to the secretary of state \$5,022.57 in taxes on sales of gasoline and distillate in Oregon for the month of June.

The Nehalem Boom company has been granted authority of the public service commission to construct an overhead crossing for an industry spur track over a county road near St. Helens and over the tracks of the Spokane, Portland & Seattle road.

According to a report filed by G. B. Lamb, county school superintendent for Tillamook county, with State Superintendent J. A. Churchill, eight routes for the transportation of pupils to and from schools are in operation in that county during the school year. The cost during the last year was \$8184, or an average of \$1023 for each route. Five teachers' cottages in the county are not credited with much success, but twenty-one play sheds in connection with rural schools have been successful.

W. A. Dalziel, deputy state sealer of weights and measures, reports that more than 100,000 berry containers have been inspected by his department in the last three months.

Out of 358 accidents reported to the state industrial accident commission for the week ending July 28, three were fatal. They were: William Hewes, lineman, Portland; Charles Pohjola, lumber worker, Empire, and Howard LeRoy Mains, lineman, Cottage Grove.

Judge John S. Coke of the circuit bench at Marshfield has been appointed by Chief Justice Burnett of the supreme court to sit as a temporary substitute for Judge J. A. Eakin of Astoria.

The Oregon school laws as altered by the legislature of 1921 have been mailed to the county superintendents of the state by J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of schools.

A check for \$20,458 has been turned over to the state treasurer by the public service commission representing fees from the grain inspection department of the commission for the month of July. This is the biggest turnover ever made from the department at one time.
