

CASH PRIZES TO PIG CLUB MEMBERS

An additional sum of \$400 in cash prizes is offered to pig club members of Oregon by the Union Stock Yard of Portland, for exhibits at the Pacific International Livestock exposition. G. A. Pierson, president of the company, is making the offer. Any pig club member in the state is eligible to those exhibits. Feeding pigs for the market and demonstrations of gain in weight, associated with the cost of grain and profits are the points to be brought out by the exhibits. Encouragement for the boys and girls to feed pigs and market them is the object of the Union County club leaders will supervise all work and records. Four pigs from the same litter fed for market for four months, entered at the start of the feeding period, and records kept for three months, are the rules laid out by Mr. Pierson. The first prize will be \$40, second \$33, third \$25, fourth \$20, and fifth \$15—three sets of these to be given. For prize awards the state will be divided into three districts, the first to consist of Clatsop, Columbia, Tillamook, Washington, Multnomah, Clackamas, and Yamhill; the second to consist of Polk, Marion, Lincoln, Benton, Lane, Douglas, Crook, Curry, Josephine, and Jackson; and the remaining counties to make up the third district.
