FALL FISHING SEASON OPENS 10th

The fall fishing season will open tomorrow, the 10th, but on account of low prices for the canned salmon, only two canneries on the Columbia river will operate so far as can now be ascertained. However, the local fish buyers, E. I. Ballagh and J. L. Sheldon, have arranged to take the catch of the fishermen in this district. The opening price will be for salmon 2c per lb., silversides, 3c, and steelheads, 4c. If the run is good, the fishermen can make a little money even at these prices. In speaking of the matter Mr. Ballagh said: "The fishermen in this district had a very poor season owing to the high water and other causes and while the canneries will not operate, we have decided to take the catch of the fishermen and will depend upon the local markets to dispose of the fish. Not twice is very high and some of the nets stand only one season's use, so if the fisherman can use his net for the fall fishing and dispose of his catch at the prices named, he will be able to pull out of the hole and have a little surplus left, and that is why we have agreed to buy their fish."

He advises those who wish to get salmon for the winter to leave orders with Harve Wilkins, phone 85. Mr. Ballagh went to Portland, Vancouver and Stevenson Wednesday to make arrangements for the disposition of the fish.

The government of Jamaica plans to expend \$1,750,000 for the extension of the sewerage and water systems of Kingston. A power station estimated at \$150,000 will be erected and street lighting will be improved.

Cost of Troops on Rhine

Germany owed the United States up to April 30 last \$240,744,511 for maintenance of American troops on the Rhine. Secretary Weeks sent the figures to the Senate in answer to a resolution by Senator Borah. The total cost of the American occupation forces December 18, 1918, to April 30, the last date for which accounts were available, was placed at \$275,324,192. There are now 500 officers, 12,241 enlisted men and 5 nurses in German territory, Secretary Weeks said.
