**STATE CAPITAL NEWS LETTER**

Governor Olcott has granted the extradition of Frank Eibourae, who is wanted in Cuming county, Nebraska, on a counterfeiting charge.

P. L. Hurd, who has seen much of the world in the naval service, has been chosen as physical director at the State Training School for boys.

The Oregon school for the deaf will begin its next school term September 20 with an attendance of about 119. This will be an increase of about 5 per cent over last year.

The Lafayette State bank has been closed by order of Frank C. Bramwell, state superintendent of banks. The bank is in charge of Fred W. Bland, state bank examiner.

Oregon has no open season on beaver according to the opinion of Attorney General Van Winkle, written in reply to an inquiry by A. E. Burghdoff, state game warden.

The secretary of state's office is furnishing the bureau of the census of the department of commerce certain financial statistics of the state. Similar data are being gathered from other states for government reports.

The public service commission has issued an order making a cut of from 5 to 33 1-2 per cent on the freight rate on sand, gravel and crushed rock in Oregon. This was on application of the state highway commission and several county courts.

Motor vehicle registration for August totalled 3185 cars, according to a statement from the secretary of state. The total fees from all classes of registrations were \$41,925.75. The total number of vehicles registered for the year is 112,484, and the total in fees so far this year is \$2,279,142.25.
