Camouflage. The art of camouflage originated with Abbott Henderson Taylor, who died at his home in Monadnock, New Hampshire. Mr. Taylor painted a portrait and landscape painter. It is pronounced that he will be known for his skill in camouflage. In 1896 Mr. Thayer set forth in a paper, published by the Smithsonian Institute, his observations upon the protective coloring of animals and the optical laws which explain the markings in animals. He pointed out that the zebra stripes along its back and the zebra stripes— not to make them conspicuous but to make them inconspicuous in their own environment. It was from the protective coloring of animals that the art of camouflage was born. Mr. Thayer and his son were the first to apply the art of artists in the war to battleships and ammunition. Mr. Thayer served in England during the war, directing the art of camouflage.

FARM LANDS INCREASE IN VALUE

Although Oregon farm lands have increased only 15.9 per cent in area in the last ten years, their value has jumped 5 per cent in the same period, from \$528,245,782 to \$618,559,751. This is brought out in a statistical report which has been prepared for use at the Pacific Northwest Fruit Exposition which is to be held at the Bell Street Terminal in Seattle from November 21 to 26. The greatest increase in the farm value is the result of the growing use of mechanical methods in fruit culture—which, in Oregon, is practically synonymous with agriculture. The report shows that farm machinery during the decade increased 214.5 per cent, while buildings were jumping 192.8 per cent in value and the actual land only 4.4 per cent.
