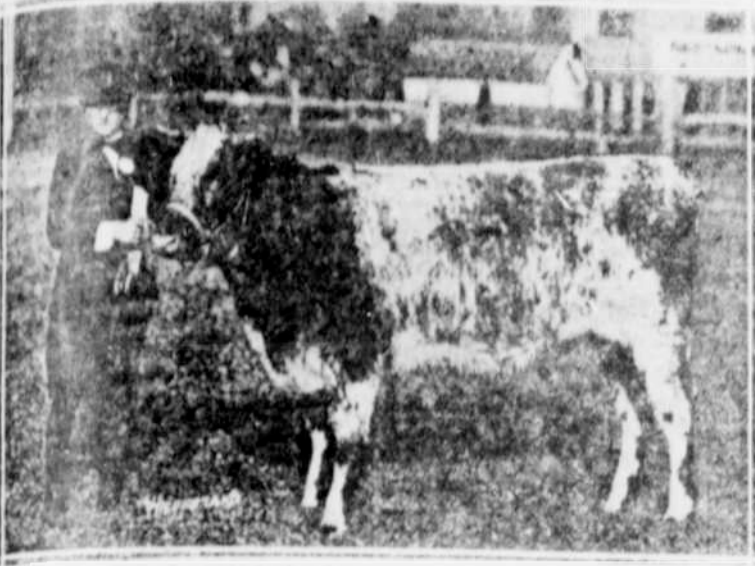


Dale West and His Winning Heifer

LUMBER CENTER IN NORTHWEST

The 1920 lumber cut for Washington and Oregon, according to data just given out by the forest service offices here, shows a decided increase over a previous year.

The lumber cut of the United States as a whole in 1920 was 35,758,800,000 feet, which is 2.2 per cent less than in 1919, and 27 per cent less than the peak in 1907.

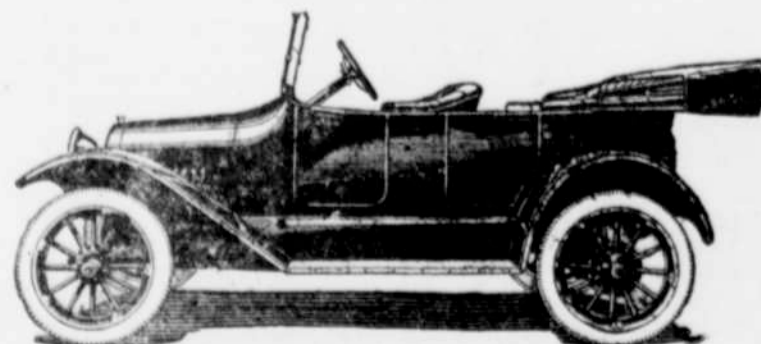
