864,763 VETERANS AIDED LAST YEAR
Three hundred and forty-four chapters of the American Red Cross comprising the Atlantic Division with headquarters here, during the last year gave assistance in one form or another to 864,763 veterans of the World War. This service was rendered at a cost of approximately \$1,139,416. Of the more than 20,000 disabled men who are being cared for by the Veterans' Bureau throughout the country more than 1,599 are being treated in hospitals in the Atlantic Division and their comfort is one of the chief concerns of Red Cross Chapters. Red Cross workers are busy distributing clothing, providing entertainment and recreation and helping the families of these men.

DUNLOP.
News has just come from Dublin of the death of John Boyd Dunlop, the age of 84. His name is not familiar. But you would be getting a lot of bumps in life if it had not been for him.
Dunlop made bicycling popular, and was the father of comfortable riding, by being the first to apply the pneumatic tire to the bicycle. This was in 1888. The air-inflated tire had been patented in England in 1843, but 45 years went by before Dunlop applied the device to bicycles. Automobile manufacturers then adopted the idea.
Dunlop did the world a great service, yet he died almost unknown. Fame is reserved for the movie stars, artists, arch criminals and military heroes.
Who invented the button? The safety pin? The knife and fork? The bar lock? The pencil? The shoe lace?
You use all of these things daily, with much comfort. As in the case of Dunlop, little attention is paid to the creators of useful, everyday devices.
Future generations, let us hope, will be more sensible and will honor the really great, those who devise useful things for the world.

TEMPLE OF THE STARS.
The proposed National Victory Memorial Building in Washington may ultimately be known as the Temple of the Stars.
Its dome will be embellished with 699,699 stars—stars of gold for those who died and stars of blue for those who wore the khaki of the army and the blue of the navy during the world war.
The legislatures of the respective states will be asked to contribute a gold star for each of the state's men who died and a blue star for each man who was in the service during the war.
The cost will not be great and it is not believed there will be objection to the appropriation in a single state.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Tumblers which have contained milk should first be rinsed in cold water before washing in hot water.

Potatoes can be baked in half the usual time required if they are allowed first to stand in hot water for 15 minutes.

Place the raisins on a tin plate and heat them thoroughly in a hot oven to make them split open easily for the removal of the stones.

Heavy mud stains can be quickly removed from tan shoes by rubbing them with slices of raw potato. Polish in the usual way when dry.

A convenient place to keep the household tools can be made by fitting one of the lower steps of the back stairs with a hinge and using the interior for a tool box.

A Brazilian state will employ American experts in cotton, grain, fruit and tobacco culture, a veterinarian and a dairyman as traveling teachers.

To keep a drain sink free from grease, pour down once a week at night 1-2 can potash or lye dissolved in 1 quart of water. Should sink drain chance to get choked, pour in to sink 1-4 pound copperas dissolved in 2 quarts boiling water. If this is not efficacious repeat before sending for a plumber.

Lengthening Petticoats.
My little daughters used to outgrow their petticoats so rapidly that it seemed to me I was all the time making new ones until I hit on the plan of finishing the shoulders of the waist without sewing them up, writes one housewife. That is, I made the shoulderstraps, lapping them at the top and closing with button and buttonhole. It is then easy to let the skirt down by adjusting the straps. Instead of buttoning, the small clasps may be used to fasten them. This is a far better plan than to turn down some of the material where the skirt is sewed to the waist. Another very good plan which may be used in conjunction with the open shoulders, is to make a wide hem; then, when it is desired to lengthen the skirt you have only to pull out the tucks.
