LEGION WILL SHOW WAR PICTURES

On Thursday and Friday, December 15 and 16, the people of this community will be given the opportunity not only to witness the official war films, direct from the United States government, but to render financial aid to Columbia Post, American Legion of St. Helens, under whose auspices the pictures will be shown. These war films are for exclusive showing by legion posts in the state of Oregon, and vividly depict the action of the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th and 42nd, 51st and other divisions in their various drives during the world war.

The pictures also show these troops on transports, activities, anti-air battles, embarkation ports, base ports in France, troops going to the front, action of the divisions, infantry, artillery, airplanes, tanks, etc., and a review of the divisions by General John J. Pershing, commander-in-chief of the A. E. F., prior to entraining for home ports.

Action is shown in the drives of Chateau Thierry, Soissons, Aisne-Marne, St. Mihiel and Meuse-Argonne, in which historical drives some of Columbia county's sons participated. It is the opinion of the Department of Oregon that these are the best history pictures ever gotten up of the World War, and it is on its recommendation that Commander Wellington and the ex-service men of the legion will present them to the people of this community on the days heretofore given.

The local legion, whose membership is from all parts of the county, is in need of funds for carrying on its work, and Manager Gates of the Liberty Theatre has tendered the ex-soldiers the use of his playhouse for a two nights benefit. And there can be no question but that the people of the county will be equally liberal in their support of the undertaking through the purchase of tickets, thus making it a benefit in fact, don't wait to be approached, but buy at the Plaza drug store, where tickets will be on sale Monday.

FARM POINTERS

Pullets are likely to show a drop in egg production, often traceable to over feeding at this season of the year. Those starting to lay in October or early November develop a keen appetite and consume on the average more feed than they will later on. The tendency to overfeed should be avoided carefully at this time and if anything the amount of scratch grain should be reduced. Should the birds stand around idle cut down the feed until they again get busy scratching in the litter.

AUTOMOBILES MUST HAVE NEW PLATES

Sheriff J. H. Wellington has announced that he is in receipt of word from Secretary of State Koser to the effect that applications for 1922 motor vehicle licenses have been sent to all car owners in Oregon and that there will be little or no excuse for not having license plates by the first of the year.

The sheriff announces that no car will be allowed to operate after January 1 with the 1921 license plates on. He announces that he will issue temporary licenses after December 31 for only those cars purchased after that date.

"If you have already made your application for a license for the year 1922, or if you mail one to the secretary of state this or next month and do not get your plates before the first of the year, leave the old plates on your car until the new ones arrive," said the sheriff. "Mail in your application now. When your 1922 plates arrive do not put them on your car until January 1."

When Roasting Beef
