Association to Hold Business Session Then Consider Subject of Co-operative Marketing.

The Oregon Dairymen's association one of the oldest agricultural bodies in the state, will hold its annual meeting at Corvallis Farmers' week on Thursday, December 29. After a short business session it will take up for special consideration the problem of cooperative marketing of dairy products.

Members of this association feel that this is one of the most important problems facing the dairy industry today," says P. M. Brandt, head of the dairy husbandry department at the state college. This association has already contributed a great deal to the building up of the dairy interests in Oregon, and its efforts in the marketing problem will be constructive.

Definite ideas on the value of the cooperative system and methods of making it effective are held by W. K. Taylor, dairy farmer and many times president of the association. He endorses the idea of giving it special consideration at the forthcoming meeting and believes fully in the possibilities for its success.

C. L. Hawley, state dairy and feed commissioner and dairy stock breeder, is president of the association.
