LAND CLEARING SHOWN AT MIST

Successful Demonstration Attended By 150 People at Melis Farm near Mist—Columbia and Clatsop Join in Demonstration.

County Agent Hollibaugh returned to St. Helens last Saturday night after having been in the Nehalem for several days. He states that the land clearing and stump burning demonstration held at the A. H. Melis farm near Mist on Saturday was the most successful demonstration yet held in the county. About 150 people attended the demonstration which was superintended and explained by Professor Scudder of the Oregon Agricultural College. County Agent Melis of Clatsop county joined with Mr. Hollibaugh in arranging for the demonstration. The county agent of Cowlitz county, Washington, was present and a number of farmers of that county. It is thought that similar programs will be conducted in the Washington county.

Mr. Hollibaugh stated that one very interesting demonstration was that of the DuPont Powder company. They demonstrated their old powder and then demonstrated their new stumping powder, the Pacific stumping. The demonstration clearly showed, Mr. Hollibaugh stated, the superiority of the new product over the old and the farmers were much interested. Two representatives of the company were present and H. Salisbury of the Zytett Stump Burning company was also an interested onlooker.

The ladies of the Mist section served a fine dinner in the Mist hall at noon and afterwards Prof. Scudder and the county agents made brief talks as to the advantage of adopting the stump burning method demonstrated. Mr. Hollibaugh believes that the demonstration will be productive of good results and that much land clearing will be the result of the demonstrations which have been held in Columbia county since it has been proved to the farmer that by using the method recommended he can clear his land at a much lesser cost than by using other methods.
