

RECIPES

New Mexico Cake

One cup sugar creamed with 1/2 cup butter or lard. Add yolks of 2 eggs, 1/2 cup milk, 2 cups flour, a pinch of salt and flavoring to taste. Generally use vanilla and orange together. Beat thoroughly. The success of your cake lies in the beating. Lastly add the well beaten whites of the 2 eggs. For icing pour 1/2 cup boiling water over 1 cup of sugar. Let it boil until it "bairs". Remove from the stove and pour over the well beaten white of 2 eggs stirring briskly. Beat until all is a creamy mass.

Apple Custard Pie

Line a pie plate with plain pastry and then place in a mixing bowl one and one-half cups of thick apple sauce, sweetened to taste, one cup of milk, yolks of two eggs, teaspoon of salt, one-half teaspoon of nutmeg. Beat with Dover egg beater to blend thoroughly and then turn in prepared pastry and bake in a slow oven for 30 minutes. Place whites of eggs in a bowl and add two-thirds glass of apple jelly. Beat until mixture holds its shape. Pile on pie when cooked and brown lightly in hot oven.

Russian Potato Salad

Dice enough cold boiled potatoes to fill three cups. Chop fine enough onion with half a pepper to fill one cup. Drain a can of sardines, skin, bone and flake them fine. Add a half cup of garlic chopped fine to a half cupful of French dressing. Cut fine the white center of a small head of chicory. Toss together the potato, onion, fish and chicory, add the dressing, dust with paprika and let stand to flavor 20 minutes. Serve in small white cabbage leaves garnished with tiny pickled onions.

Waffles

Three cups of flour, 1/2 teaspoonful salt, 1 cup butter, 1 cup sugar, 7 eggs, 1/2 lemon peel grated, 1 yeast cake, 2 cups milk. Cream butter, add sugar and the yolks of the eggs singly and grated lemon peel. Add flour and milk alternately beating until it is full of bubbles. Add the dissolved yeast cake and the stiff whites of eggs. Let rise three hours and bake as ordinary waffles.

Home-Made Mustard

Four tablespoonfuls flour, 2 tablespoonfuls mustard, 4 tablespoonfuls sugar, 1 teaspoonful salt, 1 teaspoonful pepper. Mix dry ingredients, then add boiling water and cook until fine paste. Then add 1 cup vinegar.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

When bamboo furniture becomes cloudy and dull wash it in water in which a little salt has been dissolved. Wash chamois gloves in warm suds and rinse in water of the same temperature to which a little olive oil is added. They will dry soft and as good as new. Whitewash the inside of your window box before putting in the earth. This will keep the box from rotting and prevent insects. Sprinkle salt on an open fire and hold your plumes over the smoke. This will curl the plumes swiftly and naturally. If the pearl buttons on your dress become dull rub them with olive oil and polish with a soft cloth. This will make them look like new. Don't forget that fresh meat should be started to cook in boiling water while salt meats should be put on in cold water and allowed to get hot with the water.

INDUSTRIAL NEWS NOTES OF OREGON

Salem—Local flax plant has order for 4 carloads from Belfast, Ireland. Portland—Pacific Lime and Gypsum Co. to build \$25,000 offices. Pendleton—\$50,000 to be spent in 1922 on Grant county highway. Union—\$66,837 paving contract let. Oregon paid \$1,864,498 gasoline tax for past year. Freewater building \$25,000 community house. The Dalles Chamber of Commerce boosting fruit production. Hood River—Underwood section to build pre-cooling plant. The state general tax levy reduced from 5.95 to 2.47 mills. Haines—Highway to Olive lake to have \$4,000 improvements. Light and power company will expend \$198,000 in Baker and Union counties. Riddle—11,000 date prune trees planted on 200 acres here. Sisters—Squaw Creek irrigation district to issue \$25,000 bonds. Astoria to get 200 head Guernsey cattle. Freewater—New ice plant, \$30,000 church and brick block building. Kenton—Local company to establish plant for manufacture of lumber.
