

COUNTY AGENT GIVES
WHITEWASH MIXTURE

A weatherproof whitewash suitable for exteriors is made as follows: Stake a bushel of lime in twelve gallons of hot water, then dissolve two pounds of common salt and one pound of sulphate of zinc in two gallons of boiling water and pour into the whitewash. Into all this stir two gallons of skimmed milk and mix well. Strain through coarse cloth.

To make what is known as government whitewash, stake half a bushel of quicklime with boiling water, keeping it covered during the process, which will require several hours. Strain it and add a peck of salt dissolved in warm water, three pounds of ground rice put in boiling water and cooked to a thin paste; then add half a pound of Spanish whiting and a pound of clear glue dissolved in warm water. Mix them well together and let the mixture stand for several days. Keep the wash in a kettle or a portable furnace and apply hot.

Another very good wash, which spreads on like paint, is made by slaking a bushel of quicklime in fifteen gallons of water. Keep the barrel or vessel covered until steam ceases to rise and stir occasionally to prevent scorching. To this add a paste made of three pounds of rye flour beaten up in half a gallon of cold water and cooked by stirring in two gallons of boiling water. Dissolve about three pounds of rock salt or coarse salt in two and a half gallons of hot water and pour in the whitewash, stirring until thoroughly mixed. This whitewash is the best for interiors. It is said a timber coated with it will not catch fire so readily as the bare wood.

A pound of cheap soap dissolved in a gallon of boiling water and added to five gallons thick whitewash gives it a gloss like paint. Silicate of soda, in proportion of one to ten of whitewash, produces a fire proof coating.
