

**ORDINANCE NO. 281.**  
ordinance Prohibiting all Persons Affected with an Infectious Disease in a Communicable Form, or Without a Health Certificate from the Health Officer of the City of St. Helens, Oregon, from Engaging in any Work which occasions the Handling of Food or Drink for Human Consumption; and Further Providing for the Issuance of such Health Certificates to Those Found Free from Such Disease or Diseases and Declaring an Emergency.

**THE CITY OF ST. HELENS DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. No person affected with any infectious disease in a communicable form, or without a health certificate as provided for in the following section, shall engage, be employed or serve in any work, occupation or employment within the City of St. Helens, Oregon, which requires or occasions the handling of food, liquid or material intended for food or drink for human consumption, or the handling of any article used in the preparation or serving of food or drink for human consumption, and shall be unlawful for any owner, proprietor, manager, or agent or representative of such owner or proprietor of any establishment, to lease or occupy to employ or retain any occupation for the performance of such service any person who is without such certificate or does not exhibit the same or who is known or reasonably believed to be affected with any such disease, or shall be unlawful for any person known of having reasonable cause to believe himself or herself to be affected with such disease to seek or continue in such employment or service. This section shall not apply to any person who handles such food or liquid or food products exclusively while contained in wrapped boxes, cases or other containers or by mechanical means in such manner that such food cannot come in contact with the hands or any portion of the body of such person, being intended hereby to prevent the handling of such food, liquid food products, dishes or other articles in any manner whatever where such disease or diseases may be spread or communicated.

Section 2. Each person who may be engaged in any occupation, work or service covered by the preceding section or intending to engage therewith in said City, shall, on or before the 10th day of June and the 1st day of December of each year, present himself or herself to the Health Officer of said City, for examination, which examination shall be made without charge, and if it is found from such examination that such person is free from any such disease, a certificate of health shall be issued to such persons. No such certificate shall have any validity, force or effect after the date herein fixed for the next succeeding examination, and any person who may be engaged in any work, occupation or service covered by the preceding section shall exhibit such certificate whenever requested to do so by any City Inspector or by the employer of such person. It shall be unlawful for any person to obtain such examination from said City Health Officer without being engaged or intending to engage in such work, occupation or service, and it shall be unlawful for any person to make any false statement or representation for the purpose of obtaining such examination or for the purpose of obtaining any such certificate. It shall be unlawful for any person who may have obtained any such certificate to give or loan the same or allow any one else to use the same, and it shall be unlawful for any person to exhibit as his or hers any certificate which may have been issued to some other person, or to state or represent that he or she has obtained or has such certificate when such is not the fact. Any person who may be engaged in the work covered by this section shall whenever required by the Health Officer of the City submit to a further examination for the purpose of determining whether or not such person has contracted any such disease since the previous examination, and it shall be unlawful for any person to continue in such work, employment or service unless a further examination be taken, and such person found to be free from such disease, and if such person is found to be affected with such disease it shall be unlawful for such person to keep or have any certificate previously issued, and such person shall surrender and turn over such certificate to the Health Officer of the City, and it shall be unlawful for such person to refuse or neglect so to do.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or association to engage in any business or occupation covered or mentioned in the two preceding sections without first obtaining a license from the City Council so to do. Application for such license shall be made in writing to said City Council, setting forth the correct name of the applicant and of all persons interested either as owner, proprietor or manager and the place of location where such business or occupation is to be conducted. If after an inspection of the premises such location is found to be sanitary and in a sanitary condition as to cleanliness, and after an investigation the applicant is found to be a person of good character a license shall be issued to such person, firm, corporation or association, to conduct such business or occupation; but subject revocation in the event that such place is not kept clean and sanitary. All licenses shall expire at the end of the calendar year in which they are issued, but may be renewed upon application for their initial issue; and the issue or renewal of each license shall be a fee of Five Dollars shall be paid. The City Council of said City has authority to visit and inspect any location or place where any business or occupation is conducted at any time in order to as-

certain whether the same is conducted in compliance with the requirements of law including the provisions of this ordinance, and if not so conducted the license of any such person, firm, corporation or association so offending shall be revoked and such business or occupation closed.

Section 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than Ten Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the City jail for not less than five days nor more than fifty days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 5. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing conditions are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety; and owing to the urgent necessity of putting into effect the various provisions of this ordinance an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor of said City of St. Helens, Oregon. Read the first time March 29, 1922.

Read the third time and passed March 29, 1922.

Approved by the Mayor, March 29, 1922.

## JERSEY BREEDERS' YANKTON MEETING

A very successful meeting of the Columbia County Jersey Breeders Association was held at Yankton, Saturday, March 18th, with a good membership present. A splendid lunch was served at noon. In the afternoon various subjects of interest to the Jersey breed were discussed. Resolutions were passed condemning the proposed change in official testing, requiring the animals to be milked under supervisor previous to the test, and supporting the action of the Oregon Hay Growers' Association in their efforts to obtain for Oregon hay growers the same benefits as those the Washington hay growers receive on like distances of land and to have the discriminating rates now in effect in Oregon revised. The association unanimously agreed to support and adopt the plan presented by County Agent Holbaugh for the pure bred dairy sire campaign which will be started in Columbia county in the near future.

The house appropriations committee has approved the estimate of \$400,000 for the Powder River irrigation project in Baker county, and \$500,000 for the Umatilla project.
