Attention is called to the Jersey breeders meeting in Rainier on Saturday, April 22nd.

Mr. W. G. Parent, an experienced veterinarian now practicing at Ellensburg, Washington, has decided to locate at St. Helens for practice in Columbia county.

The supply of brood sows throughout the northwest is very low, which means a future scarcity of hogs to supply our markets.
