

PERMIT ISSUED FOR WATER APPROPRIATION

Information from the office of Percy A. Cupper, state engineer, states that during the months of January, February and March seventy-four permits were issued by the state engineer for the appropriation of water from streams throughout Oregon. The permits cover the irrigation of 10,160 acres of land, the development of 1,893 horse-power, and the use of water for mining, municipal, domestic and various other purposes. The estimated cost of construction work under the permits is approximately \$213,000.
