

American Legion

Hanford MacNider, national commander of the American Legion may be a guest of the Oregon department at its fourth state convention in The Dalles next July.

The national commander expects to attend the Frontier day celebration in Cheyenne, Wyoming, a few days prior to the opening of the Oregon convention, and come on to The Dalles.

Commander MacNider was wounded at St. Mihiel, and was cited three times in general orders. He wears the Distinguished Service Cross with oak leaf cluster, Legion of Honor, Croix De Guerre with palm and one gold and silver star, and Italian War Cross.

Francis V. Galloway, chairman of the convention arrangements committee, has announced the appointments of the following: Fred H. McNeil, chairman of publicity; Halliwell S. Rice, chairman of decoration committee; J. T. Henry, chairman of registration and information; and D. C. Webber, chairman of the military parade features.

The committee plans to have various features at the state gathering including dancing, convention ball, swimming in the Columbia River, excursions, sightseeing trips, "days of '49" exhibitions and a big military parade.

Harty N. Nelson, state adjutant of the legion, returned from The Dalles announced that the coming convention of the legion and auxiliary, and the first state convention of the LaSalle Society for Veterans of the World will witness the greatest assemblage of war veterans in Oregon since the signing of the armistice.

Delegates from 110 posts of the legion and 65 units of the auxiliary will be on hand.

The Umatilla county council composed of the American Legion was organized at Pendleton. The council is composed of the seven posts in the district comprising the cities of Shanfield, Hermiston, Milwaukie, Pendleton, Athena-Weston, Placerville and Rock. Plans for a joint celebration of armistice day and a county convention of the legion men in the district were made. A naturalization and alien survey will be taken and co-operation of posts in all its activities will be endeavored.

Prairie City, Oregon, can boast of a five American Legion post although membership tops only 15. The post has undertaken to provide a new picnic camp ground for the city, the members now being busy improving the grounds, piping city water and getting up the camp.

Plans for the construction of a log cabin home for the post is well under way. This will be the first log home of the legion in the state, announced legion state officials.

Hanging in the room which Marshal Foch of France has reserved in his home for the thousands of presents he received while touring the United States under the auspices of the American Legion are the keys to eleven America's largest cities. All the gifts which America bestowed on the marshal are in his "American Room" except the famous Montana key at which now paces a cage in the Paris zoological gardens.

Time has thinned the ranks of the A. R. at St. Cloud, Minnesota, but the few remaining members have voted to disband and turn over to the American Legion the responsibility of observing Memorial and other days on which the boys of '61 have honored their dead comrades for more than half a century.

Scappoose Post 109 The American Legion will give a dance at the Nokavak pavilion at Scappoose on Saturday night, April 29. Norton's jazz orchestra will furnish the music and the Woman's Auxiliary will serve lunch. Many of the members of Columbia Post 42, of St. Helens, plan to attend the dance.

North Bend post American Legion will soon erect a \$20,000 modern home. The building as planned by the architects is estimated to cost \$17,900 and the grounds have already cost \$2,500. The post will be incorporated and shares of stock will be issued to raise funds to put up the building.

A show which netted the Springfield Legion post over \$150, included five reels of movies, "The Rookies Return," a "black face act," a night with the ghosts, and an exhibition of rope climbing. Entertainment concluded with a pie eating contest by members of the post.

Madras American Legion post will build a home for use of the post and citizens of the community. At the meeting of the post to discuss this matter one thousand dollars was immediately pledged by the membership. Construction on the home will be started shortly.

Through donation work by the members of the post and with the aid of teams furnished free, the Ray Johnson post of Redmond is laying its foundation for the swimming tank. Construction of club house will be started shortly.

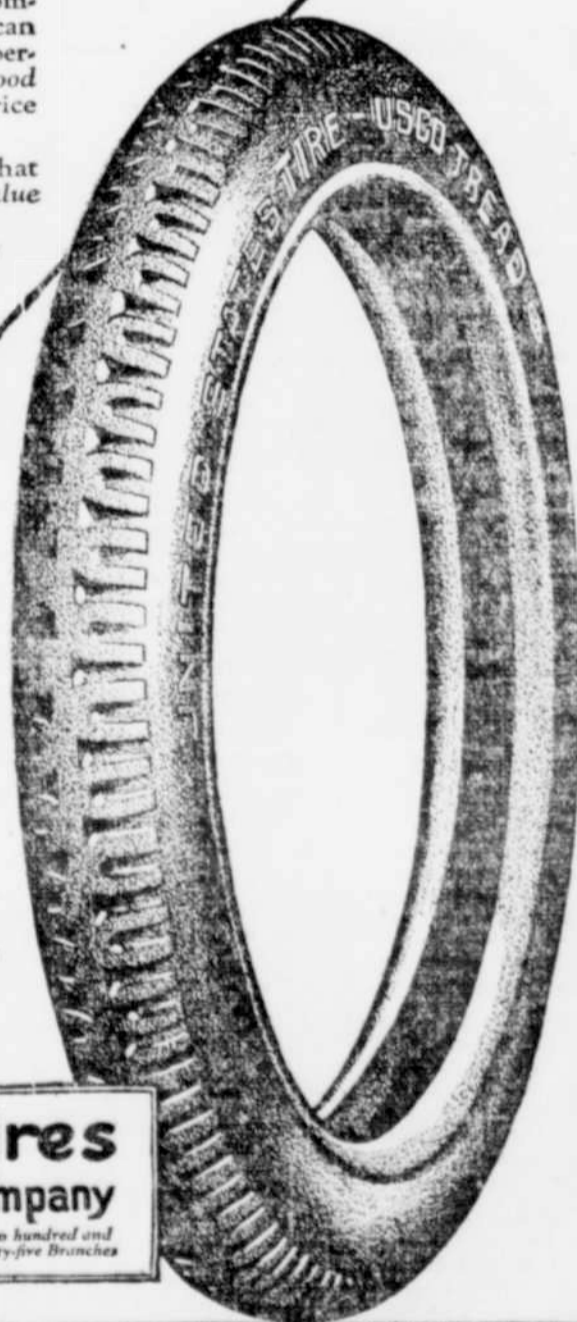
