

RED CROSS AIDS
RUSSIAN REFUGEES

National headquarters of the American Red Cross has made an appropriation of \$10,000 for the Vladivostok chapter of the American Red Cross, according to information received by Col. George Filmer, the manager of the Pacific division.

Cabled advices report 10,000 refugees wholly destitute and the appropriation is made for immediate relief work until the July harvest.

"Although much suffering was expected in this district during the winter," reports the chairman of the Vladivostok chapter, "we were not prepared for the great increase in the number of refugees. They have come in from European Russia and the interior of Siberia until it is estimated there are now about 30,000 in or near Vladivostok."

The chapter report continues saying: "The government has been housing them in the old military barracks and trying to give them one meal a day, but it is no longer able to do this. One group of Cosacks and their families has been living for six months in a railway car. They have been supplied with nothing but a weekly ration of flour and have appealed to the American Red Cross for clothing and other provisions."

Red Cross chapters in the Far East have been asked to aid the Vladivostok chapter within the limit of their resources. The Japan chapter, which was the first to respond to the appeal gave 500 yen.

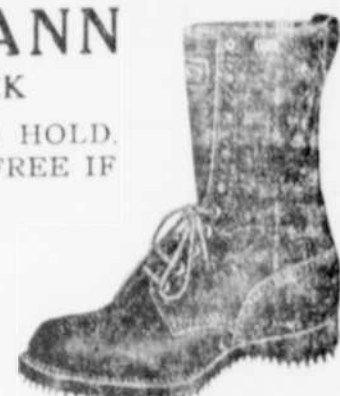
