Spotted Beetles Arrive

The western twelve-spotted cucumber beetle, one of the most destructive and general feeders in the garden, is making its appearance now...

Chicks Get Overheated

Young chicks in brooders are easily overheated after they get to be three or four weeks old unless the temperature is greatly reduced from that maintained the first few days...

Fear Fruit Worm Serious

Pear growers are advised to examine blossom clusters carefully for small greenish worms. If evidence of their presence is found it is entirely practical to add arsenate of lead to the pink spray for scab control...

Old Leaves Carry Disease

Spade under the old leaves in the garden or berry patch to get rid of these disease-carrying remnants of last year. To permit the old leaves to remain on top often means an abundance of new leaf spot or anthracnose infections.

Less Fertilizer Needed

Smaller amounts of fertilizer are needed on cultivated crops when the material is applied in the rows instead of broadcasted. Succeeding crops, however, do not receive as much benefit from the application.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Bread Pudding

Put a layer of small pieces of dry bread, well buttered, in a buttered pudding dish. Cover with a layer of large seeded raisins, add another layer of bread, sprinkle with sugar, taste with butter, add a grating of nutmeg and proceed until the dish is full...

Macaroni Au Gratin

Boil half a package of macaroni. Take a shallow vegetable dish and grease it well with fresh butter. Place a layer of the boiled macaroni on it with a few pieces of butter on top. Sprinkle well with grated cheese. Then place another layer of macaroni, treat as above on top of this and so on until the dish is filled. Then sprinkle the top with some fine bread crumbs, place in oven just long enough to brown the top. Serve very hot.

Rice Flour Cookies

Two eggs, well beaten, 3-4 cup of sugar, 1 tablespoon melted fat, 6 tablespoons milk, 1 1/2 cups rice flour, 3-4 tablespoon salt, 2 teaspoons baking powder, 1 cup grated coconut, 1 teaspoon vanilla. Mix together the ingredients in the order given, drop the batter by the spoonful on a greased baking sheet and bake for 15 minutes in a moderate oven.

Ginger Cookies

Cream together 1 cup each of sugar, shortening and molasses. Add 1 cup hot water in which 1 tablespoon of soda has been dissolved. Add 1 tablespoonful ginger and flour to make a soft dough. Roll thin, cut and bake in a quick oven.

Fish Balls

One cup salt fish, two cups potatoes, one egg and a piece of butter. Chop the fish fine and peel and cut the potatoes fine. Then boil together. When done, mash, add the egg and butter. Then make into balls.

Fried Cakes

1 cup sugar, 1 tablespoonful shortening, 1 cup milk, 2 teaspoonfuls of baking powder, a pinch of salt, 1/2 teaspoonful lemon extract.
