## HOW OREGON MUST PREPARE FOR TRADE

Oregonians can do more to aid in settlement of international problems by developing industry of the state than is possible in any other way.

Such is the opinion of John Barrett, former directors general of the Pan-American union and ex-minister of the United States to four foreign countries, expressed during a recent visit to this state.

Barrett based this belief upon the premise that encouragement of industry would result in growth of trade and corresponding development of world leadership for the United States.

But maximum development of industrial Oregon and the Pacific Northwest is based upon still another premise and that is support of Oregon products by Oregon people. Unless the industry of the state is encouraged through the purchase of the products at home and similar support that industry can never attain the proportions which will permit it to enter the channels of foreign trade.

The natural conclusion is that every purchase of Oregon products by people of the state aids, even though in an infinitesimal way, the settlement of world conditions.

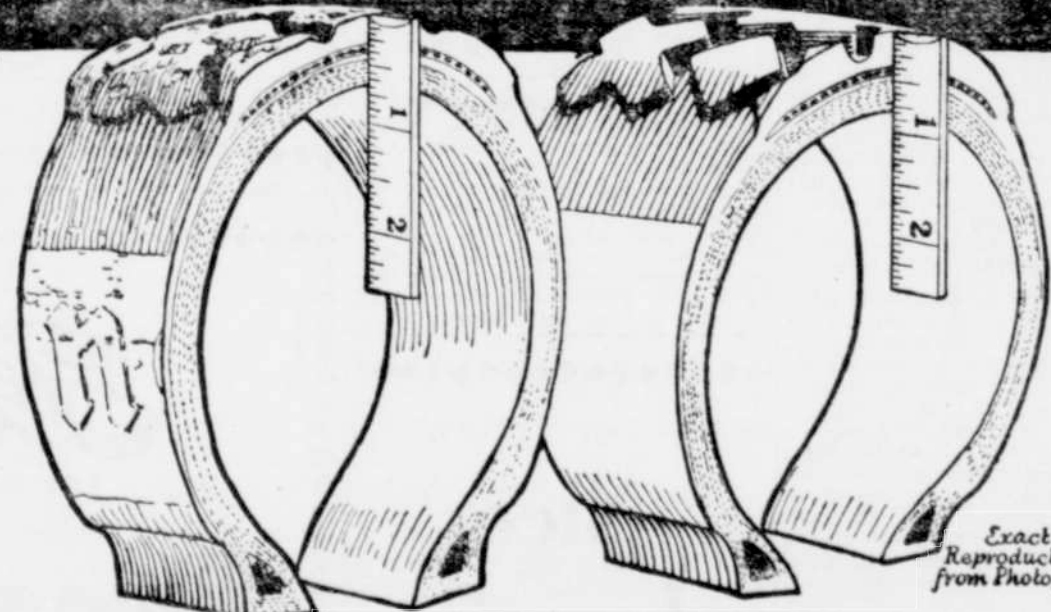
