GIVE MAY AVERAGES

According to the report of Jack Widows, secretary of the Columbia Cow Testing association, "Spot," a grade Jersey cow belonging to John Fetter of Mayger, leads in individual butterfat production with a record of 125.5 pounds of milk and 71.56 pounds of butterfat.

A grade Holstein cow owned by Pierce & Brix of Clatskanie, was second with 179.3 pounds of milk and 62.71 pounds of butterfat, while Gardo, the register Holstein of R. Anliker, Jr., of Gobie, was third with 214.2 pounds of milk and 62.1 pounds of butterfat.

The highest herd averages for herds over 15 cows, were awarded to J. C. Connell of Westport. The 22 cows in his herd averaged 809.0 pounds of milk and 35.9 pounds of butterfat. The highest herd average for herds of 15 cows or less went to R. Anliker, Jr., of Gobie, the four Holstein cows having produced an average of 1598.1 pounds of milk and 60.9 of butterfat.

The 374 cows tested during the month produced an average of 767.3 pounds of milk and 30.82 pounds of butterfat. The number of cows producing 40 pounds or more of butterfat, was 70.

The association now has 425 cows signed up with a goal of 500 set for the first of the year. The herds signed up represent 100 per cent pure-bred sires and approximately 80 per cent of the cows are pure bred. Thirty-six breeders compose the membership of the association and Alfred W. Loy is the official tester.

Arsenate Gets the Saw-Flies.

A spray of arsenate of lead, 2 pounds to 100 gallons, on the foliage of loganberries and raspberries is needed now where saw-flies are prevalent. An angle nozzle is necessary in order to reach the under surface of the leaves. To determine if the pest is present before considerable damage results, examine the newer foliage now for small shot-like holes in the leaves. A careful examination of such leaves will show a light green, spiny caterpillar, rather hard to detect when young.

Time for 30-Day Spray.

Because of the rapid advance of the season since the arrival of warm weather, the 30-day spray for codling moth will be due in the Willamette valley about June 5 to 12. In many instances it will be possible to combine the usual 15-day spray with the 30-day application and save one spraying.

Solution for Cabbage Maggots

Corrosive sublimate 1 to 1000— that is, 1 ounce to 12 gallons of water—applied at the rate of one-half cup about the base of cabbage, cauliflower and similar plants will give effective control for root maggots. Three applications should be made at 10-day intervals.
