Household Hints

When washing a white woolen sweater be sure that it is thoroughly rinsed in several waters to remove all soaps, otherwise it will become yellow.

When your scrim curtains get too soiled and borders fade, dye them with soap dye a darker color, old blue and any shade that matches the color scheme of the room.

To remove paint from windows, add one tablespoon of coal oil to a quart of warm water, soak the paint for five minutes, then scrape with a copper penny. This leaves no marks.

Try sewing a hook and eye at the bottom of all plackets and then press down with hammer flat. This is fine where there are careless girls always ripping their skirt openings farther down.

BEGINNING OF OREGON INDUSTRY

Even before the days of the California gold fever, pioneers began to build the industrial prestige of Oregon through the establishment of crude manufacturing plants. Among the first were sawmills and gristmills but an outstanding development was the opening of a tannery in Portland in 1846.

This tannery was started by David H. Lowndale and bore the distinction of being the first plant of its kind north of Mexico and in all the territory west of the Rocky Mountains.

Mr. Lowndale selected the site for the tannery about one mile back in the forest where today Multnomah Athletic field is situated. After two years he sold his industry to two newcomers who in turn sold the plant to A. N. King, who manufactured leather at the site for 29 years.

The establishment of this mill was one of the factors in the development of the state. Prior to the time it was started residents of the Oregon country tanned their own deer and cow hides. During the first few years of its operation the owners accepted hides, wheat and other products of the territory in payment for the tannery work.
