Silverton—Silverton Storage and Commission company begins erection of cold storage plant.

65,423 IN OREGON ARE INCOMPETENT

Portland—There were in Oregon, at the completion of a survey of the entire state, started in 1920, a total of 65,423 individuals who were or recently had been social liabilities either in communities or in public institutions, demanding the support of the state. This is shown in the preliminary statistical report, just published, of the Oregon state survey of mental defect, delinquency and dependency, conducted by the University of Oregon under the direction of the United States public health service at the request of the state legislature.
Of the 62,243 dependents, 55,549 were cared for in communities, including poor farms, and the remaining 6,694 were in all types of public and private institutions. Within this state there was a total of 30,141 dependents, which classification has in the largest portion of the total.
