Sunday morning many took the opportunity to go out over the bar on the good launch Sea Foam which was used at the disposal of the guests...

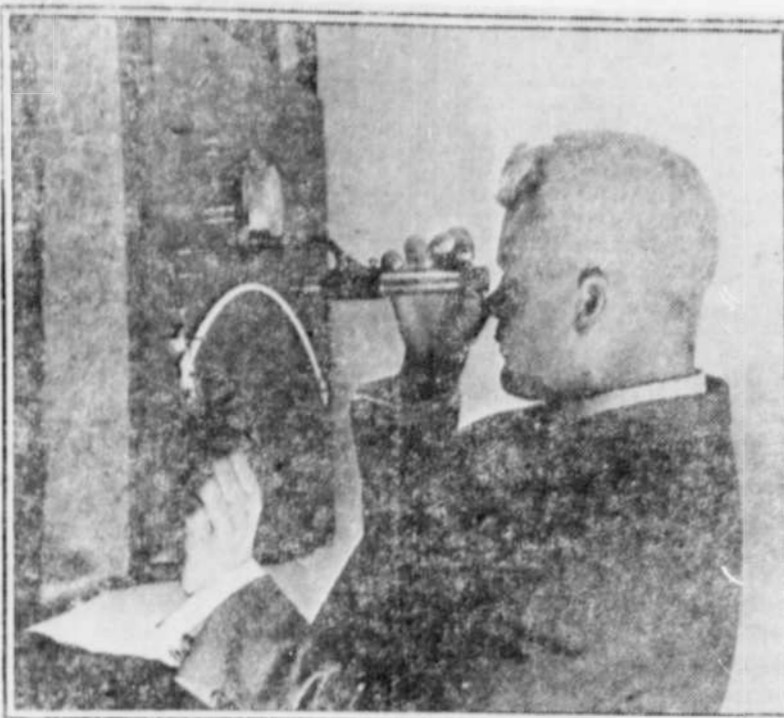
