

LUMBER CONDITIONS ON COLUMBIA RIVER

The 4-L News Letter of August 15, which gives a general summary of the lumber and logging conditions in Oregon and Washington, has the following to say as to the operations in the Columbia River district:

General—Lumber manufacturing plants are operating to capacity. Order volume is satisfactory. No car shortage has been felt as yet. Water shipments to date total more than all of 1921 cargo loadings.

Local, domestic and foreign business is good, and unless there is a serious tie-up due to rail strike, it is expected that all plants will continue to operate steadily.

Logging—Until the rains of last week, logging for a month past has been at less than 60 per cent of capacity, due to forest and slashing fires. Reduced log production has forced mills to buy anything on the market. Shortage of high grade yellow fir is especially felt.

Manufacturing and employment—There has been no change in general operating conditions during the past month. Nine mills continue to operate night shifts. Supply of men is just about equal to the demand, with little or no turnover in mill operations and with less than usual turnover reported from the logging camps.

LONG-BELL CO. ADDS MORE LAND

KELSO, Wash., Aug. 9.—The Long-Bell lumber company purchased the equity of the F. L. Stewart estate in the former Stewart place at La Du at administrator's sale at Kalama, paying \$150 for the equity, which had no real value, as the property is involved for more than it is worth, the purchase being merely to clear title.

The property gives the Long-Bell company an additional mile of deep water frontage on the Columbia. With two exceptions it owns all the frontage between the Stewart place and the Cowlitz river.

APPROPRIATIONS FOR OREGON RIVERS

The chief of engineers of the U. S. Engineering department has made the following allotments for Oregon for rivers and harbors improvement: Coos Bay \$150,000; Coos River \$2,000; Yaquina Bay and harbor, \$300,000; Clatskanie River, \$6,200; Willamette River above Portland and Yamhill River, \$27,300. The allotment for Columbia River and tributaries above Celilo Falls to the mouth of Snake River is \$12,500; Columbia and Lower Willamette Rivers, below Vancouver, Washington, and Portland, Oregon, \$850,000.

A new machine for reducing oil from shale rock is at work near Denver. The invention is a series of revolving retorts, heated by oil burners. The shale rock is dumped in the hopper and comes out at the rear of the machine as black dust made up of hydrocarbons of high commercial value. According to the president of the Colorado School of Mines, the invention will revolutionize the oil industry.
