George W. Platt of Springfield, in Lane county, co-operated with the O. A. C. extension service in showing the cost of raising pigs to the weaner stage. The farrow of one Hampshire sow, consisting of 10 pigs, was used in the demonstration.

WEEKLY REVIEW OF LUMBER MARKETS

One hundred and twenty-nine mills reporting to West Coast Lumbermen's association for the week ending August 19th, manufactured \$6,554,918 feet of lumber; sold 72,528,987 feet; and shipped 77,212,387 feet.

Production for reporting mills was 2 per cent above normal; new business, 16 per cent below production; shipments were 6 per cent above new business.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

A good way to send small coins through the mail is to stitch them by machine between two pieces of stiff paper.

To give a hurried cleaning to a brass bed, put a few drops of kerosene on a soft cloth and rub well. Then polish with a dry cloth. This shines and cleans the brass without injuring it.
