THE TELEPHONE RATES.

The new public service commission is doing the state a disservice by THE BIBLE-ANSWERS THESE withdrawing the answer of the late commission from the action instituted by phone users in the circuit

This refusal of the new commission to let the case go to trial on its merits before the circuit court is a confession that the old commission might be sustained. And that would be embarassing.

The majority of the telephone users, however, would like to know what the other court, the circuit court, thinks of the rates. The majority who protested against the present rates as being too high were sincere in their belief though probably influenced in most cases by agitators who cared less about the facts than they did about their own personal schemes and ambitions. Wherever an apparent cause for dissatis faction arises, there is always a demogog there ready to sacrifice the pub-lic good for his own aggrandize-

It is possible that the new rates are too high. We have never pro-fessed to know. Neither does anybody else know other than what the late public service commission pub lished in its findings. Nothing wa brought out in the re-trial before i to show in the slightest degree tha the commission had erred in its pre vious findings. If anything was ac-camplished in that farce, it was the confirmation of the commission's judgment.

But certain Portland people were still dissatisfied and willing to risk their money in a court trial. They brought the case as this paper fre quently urged them to do. lic service commission filed its answer in the court. The question of the ligitimacy of the rates is al-ready for trial before a judicial trib-unal. Now the newly elected commission withdraws from the case .a order to prevent the truth being im partially found out. Thus, with the commission refusing to defend the suit, there will be nothing for the court to do but decide the case in favor of the plaintiff.

If the commission had the courage of its alleged convictions when it was running for office, it would permi the case to go to trial on its merits so that the public might know the truth.--Corvallis Gazette-Times.
