FORD CARAVAN COMING TO ST. HELENS

Fieldhouse Motor Company Arranges for Demonstration of Tractors and Cars Here.

Crowds ranging in size from 500 to more than 5,000 are witnessing the Ford and Fordson power exposition at various points as it proceeds across the state. The caravan will be in St. Helens at 10:30 o'clock Friday, September 15.

As the caravan progresses it is being feted and royally received at every point. There have been several immense parades of Ford owners who have gleefully fallen in line behind the caravan, adding merit to the occasion and getting a great "kick" out of it with a most bewildering display of body types and cars of most astonishing age. One Ford owner, for example, appeared in a car to which he had attached no less than seven license plates. Another owner won a prize for the "worst looking Ford" in the Roseburg parade, and he was intensely proud of the fine performance of his "boat" despite its battered appearance. Upon another occasion a prize was offered for a Ford car carrying four generations, and the winner turned out to be a very spry old gentleman who toted, no less than five generations around in his car. Still another prize was offered for the Ford carrying any number of persons having the greatest total combined age. This prize went to a group of five persons having a combined age of 405 years, the pilot being a civil war veteran aged eighty-seven.

Farmers have been coming from miles around, bringing their families and ample picnic baskets. They have earnestly observed the several power farming demonstrations, their wives meanwhile interesting themselves in such exhibits as the Debeo Light plant, a pumping system, an electric washing machine and other devices, while the youngsters ran wild and had the time of their lives, the whole family meeting in the evening to enjoy in common the fireworks, free radio concert and other attractions.

The caravan, itself, is not exclusively a power farming show, there being a complete line of contracting equipment, including the Ersted tractor hoist which has attracted much favorable attention as a land clearing device, the Wehr roadworking machinery, a large number of trucks and trailers and innumerable specialties for truck and tractor. The maintenance of the show for a single day is said to exceed \$500.

this including such items as gas and oil, payroll, hotel accommodations and others, but the enterprise is being conducted by a dozen or more of America's largest concerns, all the representatives of which unite in expressing the opinion that the caravan's enthusiastic reception fully repays the great effort and expense necessary to conduct the show without a slip. It is unlikely, however, that even so large a combination as that of the Ford and Fordson exhibitors will undertake a similar project for several years, and when the caravan shows it may be the last time in a very considerable period.

Violin Making.

Violin making is an ancient art, yet new things may be learned about it. Two makers of musical instruments, one in Brussels, the other in Boston, have announced their belief that the material of an instrument has nothing to do with its tone. One of them has made experiments with wind instruments, but the other tried innovations in violins and violoncellos, substituting tin and aluminum for post and bridge, with an actual improvement in tone, so it is reported. It is his belief that distribution of mass is far more important to good tone than the material used. This theory is contrary to all previous opinions on the subject and if true will wipe out much of the swamping of the search for and treasuring of old violin timber.
