It is to avoid the possibility of the wrong number that central repeats the number given to her as she hears it.

WEATHER REPORT FOR AUGUST, 1922

Maximum temperature 90 degrees on 24th, minimum temperature 45 degrees on 9th; mean maximum temperature 73.8 degrees, mean minimum 50.3 degrees; mean monthly temperature 62.3 degrees which is 0.1 degree below normal. Rain 2.17 inches, which is 1.17 inch above the average. Prevailing wind NW. Thunder on 12, 14, 26 and 29. There were 16 clear, 3 partly cloudy and 12 cloudy days, while measurable precipitation fell on 7 days with 0.85 inch, the largest on 30. There were two dry and two rainy spells. The month was favorable for harvesting the grain crops while the rains relieved the drought, stopped the forest fires and supplied the much-needed moisture for all growing vegetation.

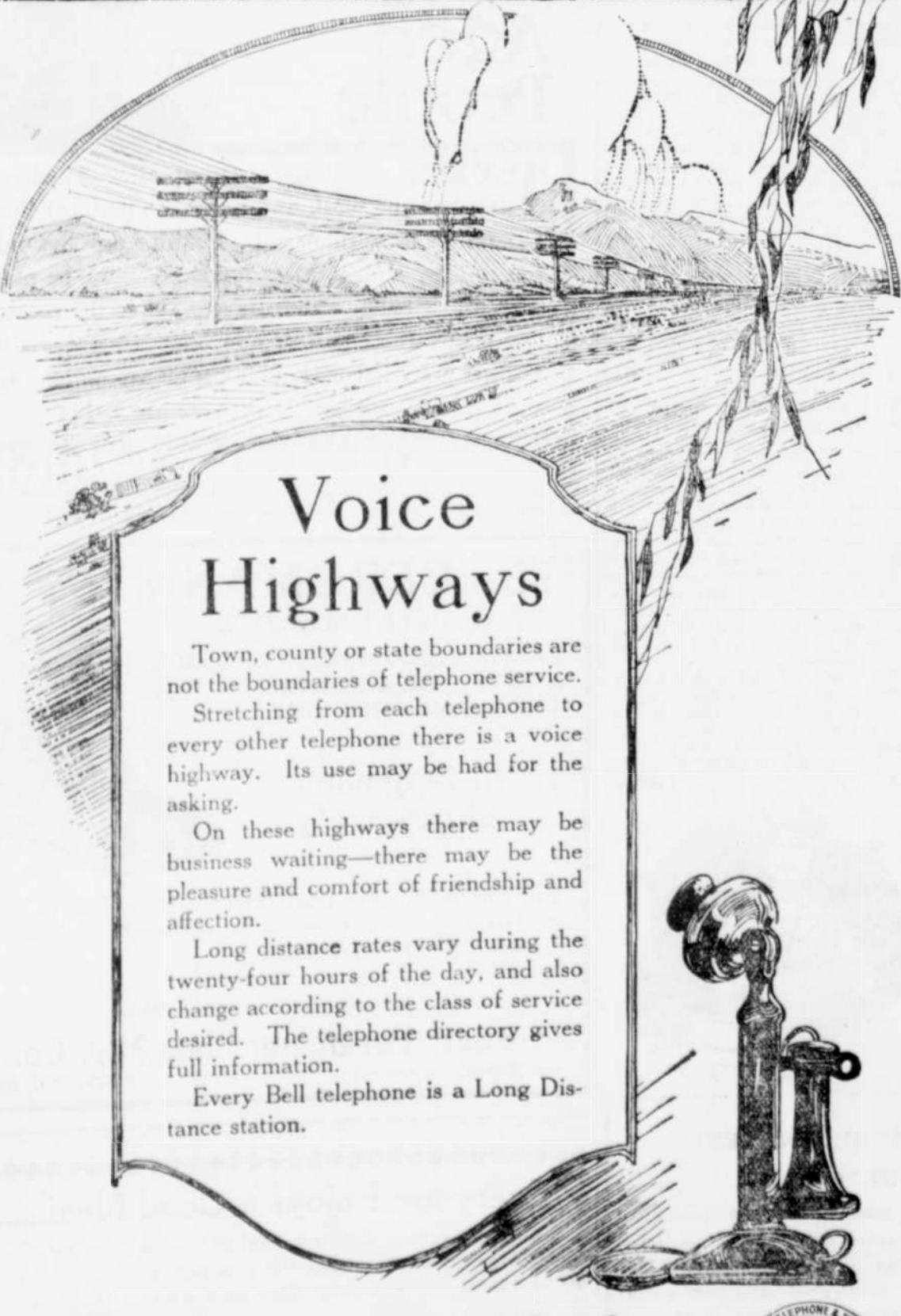
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
