

LUMBER AND LOGGING ON COLUMBIA RIVER

In their news letter of September 15th the L. News Letter has the following as to logging and lumber manufacture in the Columbia river district: Orders from both domestic and foreign markets are holding up exceptionally well for this time of year. California continues to take all stocks available suitable to take all requirements. Atlantic coast demand for shipment via Panama canal continues heavy. Volume of export business is increasing. A shipment of small logs for resawing was made this week from St. Helens to Japan. The Benson Timber Co. has had a successful season shipping log rafts to California. Production on rafts is to capacity with no continuance of tight shifts. Car short-ages has not been serious in this district, largely because of the fact that cargo loadings represent 75 per cent of shipments now being consigned. Local trade in Portland and smaller towns continues in good volume. Logging—Production is rapidly recovering from the first period curtailment and is estimated at 90 per cent of capacity from September 1 to 15. The Mowbray Logging Co., a newly formed Astoria concern, will establish a modern 100 men camp near Stamakawa, Wash. The Milton Creek Logging Co. resumed logging September 1 after being closed since June 24. The recently completed Vernonia branch of the S. P. & S. will tapping billions feet of timber, will establish the Inman-Puison and Central Coal and Coke companies to start logging operations early in 1923. Massed production and new developments have been announced recently. The Peninsula Lumber Co., Portland, will build a new \$500,000 plant. The Noyes-Holland Logging Co. and the Du Bois Lumber Co. have taken over the Bridal Veil interests in a reorganization under the name of Bridal Veil Timber Co. and have resumed Bridal Veil operations after six months' shutdown. Construction work at the new Long-Bell town near Lacview—near Kelso, Wash., is being pushed vigorously. Several hundred modern bungalows will be built soon. Construction of plant and logging railroad will probably be starting this fall. The big Hammond Lumber Co. plant at Astoria was started September 11. Estimated loss \$570,000. Insured.
