RECIPES
Date Fat La.
Two eggs well beaten, one cup of sugar, one teaspoon baking powder, one cup chopped dates, one cup of chopped nuts, one tablespoon of milk. Bake in moderate oven about 25 minutes. Let get cold and serve in sherbet cups with whipped cream. This will serve eight persons. You can make it the day before.
Tomato and Cheese Salad.
Slice the tomatoes in rather thick

Good Raisin Cookies
One cup of shortening, three cups sugar, three eggs, one cup butter-milk, one level teaspoon soda, 1-2 cupme (grated). Add enough flour to make a dough easily handled. Roll 1-8 of an inch thick, cover with granulated sugar, cut with cookie cutter and press a nice plump, juicy raisin in the center of each cookie. Bake a delicate brown.
Spreading paste, spread the slices of tomato and lay them on the lettuce leaves, then put on French dressing. Serve with hot, buttered toast fingers.

Cabbage and Tomato
4 cups of chopped cabbage, four cups trained tomato, 2 tablespoons of butter, 1 teaspoonful salt. Stew the cabbage in the tomato juice until tender; then season and serve.

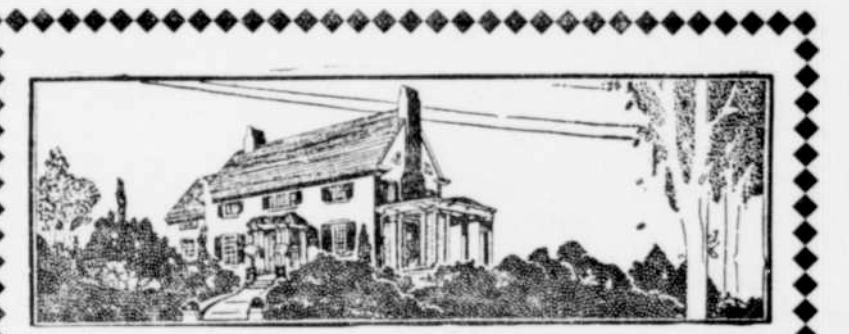
Apple Pie
For a medium sized pie, take 3 or 4 good sized tart apples, 1 cup of sugar, 2 tablespoonsful flour, 1 tablespoon butter, sprinkling of cin-
namon; line a pie pan with rich crust, pare and slice the apples thin take 3-4 cup of the sugar and 1 tablespoon flour, mix dry and put on the crust; put in apples, add rest of the sugar and flour, with sprinkling of cinnaon, dot over with the butter, put on top crust and bake in a quick oven until light brown, then lower the heat and bake slowly.
