REVENUE BOAT CAPTURES TWO PRIZES



While the U. S. Patrol Boat Hohn, under the command of Geo. V. Tawes, was cruising 8 miles off Long Beach, N. J., recently, it came upon the Schooner Luena and after a search discovered 940 cases of whiskey aboard—all Scotch. The Hohn towed the schooner toward shore and when it reached a point three miles off South Rockaway it halted another schooner crossing its path. The boat happened to be the Etta B. under command of Capt. C. A. Peters of Boston. Some of the revenue men scented booze aboard and after a search discovered a lifeboat jammed full of whiskey—548 cases in all. With the two booze ships in tow, the victorious Hohn docked at the battery with its prizes.

WEATHER REPORT SEPTEMBER, 1922

Maximum temperature 88 degrees on the 11th, minimum temperature 41 degrees on the 23rd, mean maximum temperature 69.8 degrees, mean minimum temperature 46.8 degrees; mean monthly temperature 58.3 degrees which is normal. Rain 2.59 inches, which is 0.58 inch above the average. Greatest daily rainfall 0.51 inch on the 6th. Prevailing wind NW hunder on 27th. There were 12 clear, 6 partly cloudy and 12 cloudy days, while measurable rain fell on 12 days. The rains of the first week hindered thrashing, otherwise the month was very favorable for farm operations and growing crops.

WARREN WAREHOUSE AFFAIRS CLOSED

The business affairs of the defunct Warren Co-operative Warehouse association are now closed, the adjustment bureau of the Portland association of credit men having made their final report. Creditors of the defunct concern received about 35 cents on the dollar; in other words, \$3,313.99 was paid to cover \$10,848.82 in claims. The cost of the adjustment bureau's service was \$461.84, which can be seen by adding the amounts in the following list of disbursements and itemized as an adjusters time and expense, attorney's fees and commissions.
